David acknowledged a letter the Board received from the Midcoast Community Counsel on January 28, 2015 regarding the Pillar Point RV Park outlining concerns regarding public coastal views, Surfer's Beach day use parking lot, public restrooms, and light pollution. David volunteered to meet with the Midcoast Community Counsel and the lease holder to begin talks about possible solutions.

Parravano welcomed Commissioners David and Mattusch to the Harbor Commission.

Parravano referred to a comment made by a member of the public at the January 21, 2015 meeting regarding the lack of Minutes from the December 3, 2014 meeting and

stating that they were late. Parravano stated that staff has had a lot of demands such as preparing for a special meeting, the holidays just occurred. He stated staff had responded by preparing the Minutes for the December 3, 2014 and January 7, 2015 meetings.

Parravano expressed concern regarding Committees including members of the public on the committee and stated there was no policy in place for this type of selection.

Parravano stated that the last couple of meetings there has been a change in the staff report between what is included in the staff report and amendments made after the Board packet is distributed.

Parravano stated at the last meeting, Grindy stated that he is working 80-90 hours per week. He asked for a written report from Grindy to see how his hours are being distributed.

Parravano stated he was concerned with the flow of emails. He stated that in the spirit of transparency, he asked that when the Acting General Manager receives an email request from a Commissioner, that all Commissioners be copied on the response.

Mattusch stated that asking the Acting General Manager increase his work load and felt that was counter-productive.

Brenan stated the she did not want other emails on items she has not inquired on.

Brennan agreed with Mattusch and stated that requesting an update on work load status is ironic.

Brennan commented on an issue that came up at the last Board meeting where a member of the public stated that the fish buyers were not paying for their electrical hooked up to the bait freezers. She stated that she received an email from Acting General Manager clarifying that staff conducted an inspection and found the electrical was hooked up correctly.

Brennan reported that there have been a lot of IT issues with the Harbor District's emails and she was experiencing problems. She stated that at some point down the road the Board might want to consider doing something different like using District issued devises so they can be maintained by the District's IT department.

POSSIBLE CHANGE IN LOCATION OF THREE CAPTAINS' HOIST AT PILLAR POINT HARBOR

Recommendation

Option 1

Authorize and Direct the Acting General Manager to notify all three fish buyers in writing that future hoist installations and/or proposed hoist location changes will be brought to the Harbor Commission for consideration during regular Harbor Commission meetings.

Require that all necessary permits be obtained in advance of hoist installation.

Require that copies of all permits be provided to the Harbor District General Manager for verification before final approval of hoist installation.

Option 2

Authorize and Direct the Acting General Manager to send a letter notifying Three Captains that the Harbor District is discontinuing the March 28, 2014 probationary agreement effective April 2, 2015. The lessee will have until July 2, 2015 to remove the hoist and apply for a location change that must be approved by the Harbor Commission.

And Authorize and Direct the Acting General Manager to notify all three fish buyers in writing that future hoist installations and/or proposed hoist location changes will be brought to the Harbor Commission for consideration during regular Harbor Commission meetings.

Require that all necessary permits be obtained in advance of hoist installation.

Require that copies of all permits be provided to the Harbor District General Manager for verification before final approval of installation.

Option 3

Direct the Acting General Manager to continue the District's approval of the present location of Three Captains second hoist location while its application for a Coastal Development Permit is pending, and revisit the issue of the location of the hoist until after the Coastal Commission has acted on the issue.

Background

On April 15-16, 2014 a new hoist was installed on Johnson Pier near the fuel dock. The hoist location was approved by the Harbormaster for a one-year probationary period ending April 1, 2015.

The Harbor Commission has authority to determine hoist locations on Harbor District property. The 2012 Fish Buyer lease agreements specify the following terms:

10918716.1

Fish Buyer Lease Agreement 9.0

9.1 Use

(b.) (i)

Tenant shall provide on the Premises all equipment required for the operation of said wholesale fish dealership, including winch and hoist for the purpose of loading or unloading of fish or other merchandise to and from vessels, and scales, skiff or equipment storage. Tenant may provide a second winch and hoist at a location approved in advance by the Harbor Master.

9.2.2 Compliance with Laws and Legal Requirements.

Tenant, at Tenant's sole cost and expense, promptly shall comply with all Laws, statutes, ordinances, resolutions, regulations, judicial decisions, proclamations, orders, decrees or policies of any municipal, county, state or federal government, or the departments, courts, commissions, boards and officers thereof, or other governmental or regulatory authority with jurisdiction over the Tenant and the Premises or any portion thereof, including without limitation, the Landlord, relating to or affecting the condition, use or occupancy of the Premises in effect either at the time of execution of this Lease or which may hereafter be in effect at any time during the term hereof, whether or not the same are now contemplated by the parties. Tenant's compliance shall include compliance with all provisions and conditions of the Federal Americans with Disabilities Act and California Harbors and Navigation Section 40. Tenant shall obtain and pay for all licenses and permits required for Tenant's construction and occupancy and use of the Premises. Compliance with Laws and Legal Requirements shall include compliance with all requirements of each regulatory agency that has jurisdiction over the Premises including but not limited to the Department of Boating and Waterways and the County of San Mateo.

9.2.3 Other Permits and Approvals

Should other permits, licenses, and/or Approvals, other than set forth in this Lease, be required to make Alterations or Improvements or to operate the Premises as a fish-buying operation or other use explicitly permitted hereunder, or if a failure to procure such a license or permit might or would, in any way, affect Landlord or the ability of Tenant to operate its businesses, it shall be the sole responsibility of Tenant to obtain and comply with the requirements of said permits, licenses, and/or Approvals.

Harbor District Probationary Agreement

On March 28, 2014 the owner of Three Captains signed an agreement with Harbormaster Scott Grindy. The agreement was first provided to the Harbor Commission on January 16, 2015, ten months after it was signed.

The content of the March 28, 2014 agreement follows:

For our records and files, you are authorized to install the noted hoist on the face side of the Johnson Pier at the location we have recently agreed to.

Your installation will be a "probationary or tentative" installation and location for up to 1 year as a trial for our use review. The end date of the noted 1-year will be April 1, 2015. Being this is your equipment, if there is a move required due to issues, the cost of location change will be borne by Three Captains.

The working space for the second hoist is to be 25 feet long and 8 feet wide/deep and area will be marked by a red line of paint to identify the space. As part of this activity the original space across the pier will be given up upon hoist installation and red line painted in.

Additionally, please make copies of any and all signed off permits and if so required copies of hoist certification inspections and forward them to me.

Thank you for working with us on this installation opportunity and striving to keep the fish unloading safe and secure for all parties.

Permit Status

To date a required Coastal Development Permit (CDP) has not been obtained by Three Captains.

On Nov. 6, 2014 the California Coastal Commission removed a proposed CDP waiver from the Deputy Director's Report for the Nov. 2014 Coastal Commission hearing. Currently CDP application number 2-14-1592 is being processed however additional information was requested by Coastal Commission staff.

Because Coastal Commission staff considers the CDP application to be incomplete a hearing date has not been set.

Refrigerated Bait Containers

Board action on Jan. 21 2015 (Item 10) approved notifying the Coastal Commission that an electrical project CDP for relocation of refrigerated containers on Johnson Pier will no longer be requested.

Analysis

Safety is paramount for operating any equipment on Johnson pier, and added congestion has the potential of causing an unsafe condition on the pier.

Fiscal Impact

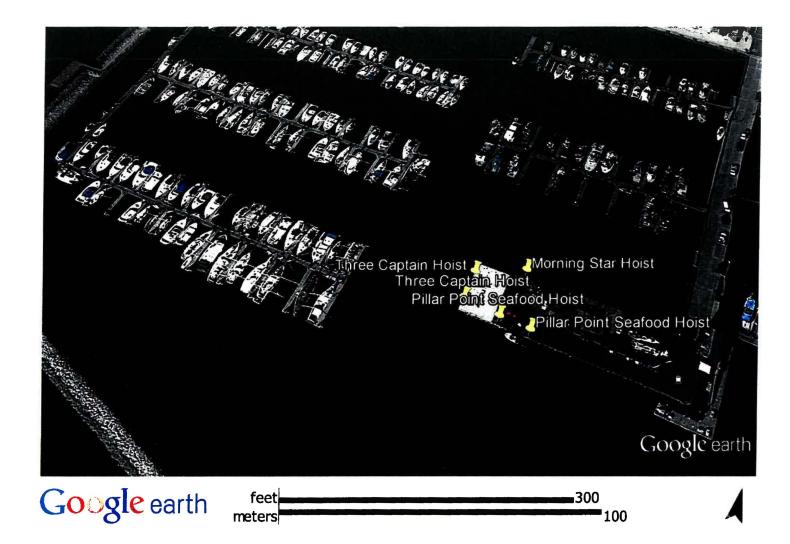
Because the lessee has not obtained a CDP they cannot use the hoist therefore the District is not obtaining any fee revenue. The potential for safety concerns should outweigh future revenue considerations.

Conclusion

Limiting hoist location to less congested traffic areas would improve operational safety conditions on Johnson Pier and better serve the District and the public.

Alternatives After a Coastal Development Permit is obtained, monitor operational safety concerns for an additional time period or until an accident/injury occurs.

HOIST ORIGINAL LOCATIONS



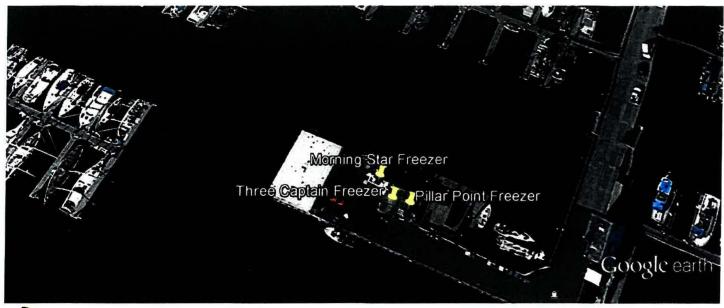

PIER BAIT FREEZER LOCATIONS

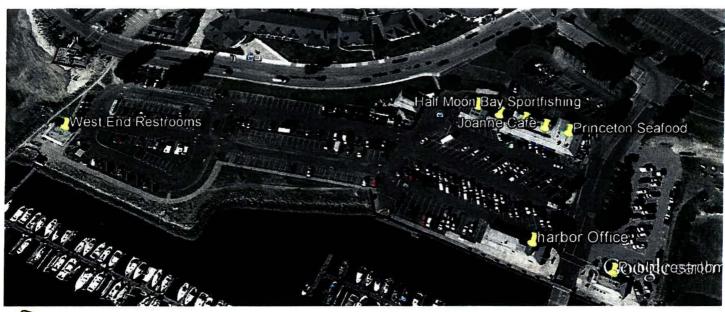

Thank you for your submittal dated January 9, 2015 and received in our San Francisco office on January 16, 2015. We received information you submitted to the San Francisco office on January 29, 2015 that was provided in support of your request for a CDP. Staff is proceeding with the processing of your CDP application as we informed you in our letter to you dated December 12, 2014 and during our telephone discussion today (February 11, 2015). As conveyed to you previously in the December 12th letter there may be additional materials necessary for filing purposes dependent upon the nature of the information you provide in response the letter-request. The CDP application, as we discussed today, is incomplete because there is additional information needed for our review, in light of the issue that has been brought to staff's attention with respect to Coastal Act §§ 30234 and 30234.5. The application cannot be deemed complete in accordance with the Commission's Administrative Regulations (Title 14 CCR § 13056).

Commission Jurisdiction

In response to your statements regarding permit jurisdiction, the Commission has permit jurisdiction as provided by Coastal Act Section 30601. The proposed development/hoist is installed on Johnson Pier, at Pillar Point Harbor, which is located between Highway 1 and the sea. The area is under the retained jurisdiction of the Coastal Commission. Coastal Act Section 30601 states in relevant part below.

Section 30601: Prior to certification of the local coastal program and, where applicable, in addition to a permit from a local government pursuant to subdivision (b) or (d) of Section 30600, a coastal development permit shall be obtained from the commission for any of the following:

(1) Developments between the sea and the first public road paralleling the sea or within 300 feet of the inland extent of any beach or of the mean high tide line of the sea where there is no beach,

whichever is the greater distance. (2) Developments not included within paragraph (1) located on tidelands, submerged lands, public trust lands, within 100 feet of any wetland, estuary, stream, or within 300 feet of the top of the seaward face of any coastal bluff.

Information Required

Please provide the following information.

- Appendix D Declaration of Posting. Your submittal, received in our office on January 16, 2015 does not include evidence of the required posting. Please post the notice (on yellow paper) that includes the North Central Coast District Office address and submit evidence of the posting, as we previously requested.
- 2. Economic, Commercial, and Recreational Needs of Commercial Fishing Industry. We previously asked you to provide a detailed description of baseline conditions (prior to installation of the hoist) and current conditions (after installation of the hoist) on the pier, such as any congestion issues and the cause(s). You indicate in your submittal that that there will not be any change to the baseline conditions on the pie r and further state that more fishermen can unload at one time. If there is more frequent turn-around time for the fishing boats (that would use the new hoist) would this create an opportunity for those fishing boats to go back out to sea and return with additional catch/product resulting in an increase in activity and the transporting of product to and on the pier? Would the additional and more frequent product being brought to the pier as a result, cause more congestion unloading and transporting the project on the pier? Please demonstrate that traffic flow on the pier would not change significantly with the new hoist. The new hoist includes a required 8 foot by 8 foot red-marked area adjacent to it. What is the purpose of this area and how does it relate to the free and clear area that the Harbor District requires on the pier? Will this 8 by 8 foot area worsen (or contribute to) congestion on the pier?

You state that the difference with the existing conditions and conditions with the new hoist is that it would be more convenient for fishermen to deliver to Three Captains and for loading equipment because they will not need to go through the existing fish buyers building to access the hoist. Please discuss if and how congestion or conflicts currently occur with the other tenants and or activities being conducted on the pier prior to and after installation of the new hoist. As we previously requested, include in your discussion/analysis as much quantified information as possible, such as estimated delays in time that may occur with loading and off-loading products and equipment, and time delays that may occur to other tenants due to congestion related to the location of the new hoist. You state that the new hoist will allow the same product to move through Johnson Pier faster. How much time does it take to unload boats from the original hoist location; and how much quicker will it be with the new hoist?

3. Alternatives Analysis. You provide evidence that the Harbor District, in-line with the conditions of the lease with Three Captains Sea Products, approved the location of the new hoist. This is supported by the September 24, 2014 letter to Three Captains. The September 24, 2014 letter however does not specifically mention the fueling dock used by the fishermen and recreational

boaters located at Johnson Pier in the vicinity of the new hoist. Please confirm if the location of the new hoist with respect to the fueling facility was considered through this approval and whether or not the new hoist affects access to or use of the fueling dock.

Please submit the above-requested information to me by no later than Wednesday February 18, 2015. We will hold your application for six months from today's date (i.e., until August 11, 2015) pending receipt of the information listed above. The application will again be reviewed after all of the above-listed materials have been received, and will be filed as complete if all is in order pursuant to Government Code Section 65943(a). Please submit all of the requested materials at the same time. There may be additional materials necessary for filing purposes dependent upon the nature of the information you provide in response to this letter request.

Please note that if staff does not receive all of the above-listed materials within six months, application number 2-14-1592 will be considered withdrawn and returned to you. This submittal deadline may be extended for good cause if you submit/make a request prior to August 11, 2015. Thank you very much for taking my call today. As we discussed, Young deNormandie, P.C. represents Three Captains Sea Products, Inc., the ("Tenant"). I appreciate the frank discussion regarding the hoist installation on Johnson Pier in Half Moon Bay ("Hoist").

As you stated in your September 24, 2014 letter (a copy of which is attached for your ease of reference):

The placement of the additional hoist --- which Three Captains Sea Products, like Pillar Point Seafood, has a right to under Section 9.0(b)(i) of the Lease -- was approved by the District's Harbor Master after careful consideration of the location of the existing fire protection equipment, the location of existing freezers, and the needs of the work dark. Locating the hoist and any other location would have required impractical relocation of other facilities, to the detriment of all lessees, including Pillar Point Seafood.

As we discussed, Tenant is a party to a valid and enforceable lease. Under that lease, Tenant is entitled to a second hoist. The installation and location of the Hoist was approved by the San Mateo County Harbor District (the "Landlord"). As your September 24, 2014 letter acknowledges, Pillar Point is a tenant of Landlord's, just like Three Captains. Pillar Point Seafood is in an adjacent space to that that is subject to the space held by Tenant.

Sabrina Brennen is a member, and now the President, of the San Mateo County Harbor District Board of Harbor Commissioners ("Commission") – and therefore a representative the Landlord.

As we discussed, Ms. Brennan is engaged in actions which appear to be actionable, acting in a fashion which is a direct conflict of interest between the Landlord and Tenant, is in bad faith and breaches the lease between Tenant and Landlord:

First, as you can see in the attached correspondence, Ms. Brennan, in her official capacity, is actively attempting to block the approval of Coast Development Permit Waiver 2-14-1592-W ("Waiver") which is currently pending before the California Coastal Commission ("Coastal Commission") See the attached Notice of Proposed Permit Waiver dated October 30, 2014 in which states, in relevant part:

Pursuant to Title 14, Section 13238 of the California code of regulations, and based on project plans and information submitted by the applicants regarding the proposed development, executive director of the California coastal commission hereby waives the requirement for it CDP for the following reasons:

The proposed project will facilitate existing marine use by allowing for ongoing operations in support of commercial fishing. It will ensure the economic and commercial use of the harbor and reduce congestion at Johnson pier during periods seasonal, high volume, fish-loads. The site does not contain sensitive habitat and the proposed project includes best management practices to avoid and minimize potential impacts to the water quality of the harbor in coastal waters. The project will not have a significant impact on visual resources, public access, or biological resources. For all the above reasons, the proposed project is consistent with chapter 3 of the Coastal Act. . . . [t]his waiver is proposed to be reported to the Commission on November 13, 2014, in Half Moon Bay.

Ms. Brennan's impermissible actions are evidenced by the attached correspondence which reflects that:

- She uses the same email address (Sabrina@dfm.com) to correspond with the Coastal Commission that she utilizes to conduct official business of the Commission (see correspondence from 2014 related to the "Morning Star Hoist" also attached).
- She met with representatives of the Coastal Commission on November 6, 2014. Not coincidentally, later the same day, the Coastal Commission issued a Notice of Executive Director's Changed Recommendations, removing the Waiver from the November 13, 2014 Coastal Commission agenda; and
- The Coastal Commission response to the public records request was directed and addressed to Ms. Sabrina Brennen in her capacity as a member of the "San Mateo County Harbor District Board of Harbor Commissioners" (a copy of that correspondence is attached).

Secondly, Ms. Brennan's actions are intended to be to the direct benefit of Pillar Point Seafoods, Michael McHenry and Porter McHenry. It is a conflict of interest and is in bad faith for Landlord's representative (Ms. Brennan) to promote the financial interests of one tenant at the detriment of the financial interests of another tenant.

Finally, because Tenant is entitled to the Hoist under its lease and now the Landlord's representative is actively working to deprive Three Captain of a benefit that it is admittedly entitled to, and the installation and location of which was expressly approved by the Landlord, Landlord is in breach of the lease with Three Captains.

Tenant has suffered significant damages as a result of the breach of contract, the bad faith and conflict of interest actions of Ms. Brennan. The commercial Dungeness crab fishery opened on November 15, 2014. The Waiver was going to be approved at the November 13, 2014. As a result of Ms. Brennan's actions which resulted in the removal of the Waiver from the Coast Commission's November 13 agenda, Tenant was not able to utilize the Hoist during the 2014-2015 season and, as a consequence, lost thousands in additional profits and will continue to lose revenue so long as Tenant is unable to use the Hoist.

Tenant demands that Ms. Brennan immediately cease and desist with any actions which may be detrimental to the interests of Three Captains under its lease with Landlord, including any action which may have the result of limiting or impeding the approval of the Waiver before the Coastal Commission. Should Ms. Brennan, or any of the Commissioners, continue to act in a way that is in bad faith and violates the terms of the lease, Three Captains will have no choice but to seek redress in the Courts and an award of damages, cost and attorney fees. Three Captains Seafood Products reserves all rights in law and equity. Thank you.

- (b) Dredging and spoils disposal shall be planned and carried out to avoid significant disruption to marine and wildlife habitats and water circulation. Dredge spoils suitable for beach replenishment should be transported for these purposes to appropriate beaches or into suitable longshore current systems.
- (c) In addition to the other provisions of this section, diking, filling, or dredging in existing estuaries and wetlands shall maintain or enhance the functional capacity of the wetland or estuary. Any alteration of coastal wetlands identified by the Department of Fish and Game, including, but not limited to, the 19 coastal wetlands identified in its report entitled, "Acquisition Priorities for the Coastal Wetlands of California", shall be limited to very minor incidental public facilities, restorative measures, nature study, commercial fishing facilities in Bodega Bay, and development in already developed parts of south San Diego Bay, if otherwise in accordance with this division.

For the purposes of this section, "commercial fishing facilities in Bodega Bay" means that not less than 80 percent of all boating facilities proposed to be developed or improved, where the improvement would create additional berths in Bodega Bay, shall be designed and used for commercial fishing activities.

(d) Erosion control and flood control facilities constructed on watercourses can impede the movement of sediment and nutrients that would otherwise be carried by storm runoff into coastal waters. To facilitate the continued delivery of these sediments to the littoral zone, whenever feasible, the material removed from these facilities may be placed at appropriate points on the shoreline in accordance with other applicable provisions of this division, where feasible mitigation measures have been provided to minimize adverse environmental effects. Aspects that shall be considered before issuing a coastal development permit for these purposes are the method of placement, time of year of placement, and sensitivity of the placement area.

Section 30234 Commercial fishing and recreational boating facilities

Facilities serving the commercial fishing and recreational boating industries shall be protected and, where feasible, upgraded. Existing commercial fishing and recreational boating harbor space shall not be reduced unless the demand for those facilities no longer exists or adequate substitute space has been provided. Proposed recreational boating facilities shall, where feasible, be designed and located in such a fashion as not to interfere with the needs of the commercial fishing industry.

Section 30234.5 Economic, commercial, and recreational importance of fishing

The economic, commercial, and recreational importance of fishing activities shall be recognized and protected.

Section 30235 Construction altering natural shoreline

Revetments, breakwaters, groins, harbor channels, seawalls, cliff retaining walls, and other such construction that alters natural shoreline processes shall be permitted when required to serve coastal-dependent uses or to protect existing structures or public beaches in danger from erosion, and when designed to eliminate or mitigate adverse impacts on local shoreline sand supply. Existing marine structures causing water stagnation contributing to pollution problems and fishkills should be phased out or upgraded where feasible.

As you know, the members of HMBSMA have expressed concern regarding the waivers of the above referenced Coastal Development Permits. We are particularly concerned about the potential for significant economic loss to our members and others operating businesses at Pillar Point Harbor.

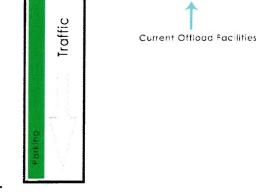
More than 100 commercial fishing vessels and three buying/offloading businesses operate out of Pillar Point Harbor. In 2013, 18.7 million pounds representing \$17.1 million dollars of seafood was unloaded over Johnson Pier.

Johnson Pier is an L shaped pier that is wide enough for approximately 3 vehicles on the East/West span and approximately 2 vehicles on the North/South side. This pier must accommodate the public as well as commercial fishing activity, including offloading, and storage of offloading equipment. Traffic on the pier includes small ______ Progosed Facility

cars and trucks, foot traffic, forklifts, and semi-trucks.

For the past 30 years, all offloading has been conducted on the northernmost part of the pier as referenced in the drawing to the right. This drawing is for general reference only and is not to scale.

The efficiency of this infrastructure is critical to the financial viability of our fleet. We believe that changes to this infrastructure without adequate study could be economically damaging and potentially reduce offload revenue by up to 20%-30%.



Specifically, the installation of a new hoist in a new location that has not previously supported offloading activity will have an indisputable impact on traffic patterns on the pier and could delay offloads for vessels. There is also a potential for access to fuel and to be impacted which will also result in delays to fishing activity.

For individual fishing vessels, delays at the dock translate directly into lost revenue. Delays are already experienced due to congestion from existing infrastructure, adding to this without a complete process and adequate study could result in even greater delays.

Every hour spent waiting to unload, are hours that cannot be spent fishing. Because fishing activities are weather dependent, extra time at the dock can sometimes result in multiple missed fishing days due to bad weather.

An example, based on Dungeness Crab: in 2013, 2.4 million pounds, representing more than 7.5 million dollars were offloaded over Johnson Pier. A 20%-30% loss in revenue due to delays could equate to 2 million dollars.

It is estimated that close to 70% of the total Dungeness Crab harvested is caught in the first 10 days of the season. Therefore a delay of a single fishing day could result in a loss of close to 10% of the projected total season revenue for a Dungeness Crab fisherman. Depending on the size and capacity of the vessel, losses could amount to \$5,000-\$40,000 per day.

The other fish buying businesses on the pier could also suffer significant economic losses if they cannot adequately move product from the vessels to the trucks, and if trucks cannot get off of the dock in a timely fashion.

Seafood is a perishable product, and Dungeness Crab are also sold live, the timeliness and efficiency of delivery is imperative for the quality of the product and payment to the vessels. (Boats are not paid for dead crab)

Other considerations are the efficient loading and offloading of equipment. During the Dungeness Crab season, 50,000-60,000 traps are loaded on and off of vessels. The inability to load vessels efficiently can further delay fishing activities.

Commercial fishing operations are very complex, and while HMBSMA members are hopeful for infrastructure changes to improve offloading facilities, the implications of any changes require study and careful consideration. Commercial fishermen are participating in a strategic planning process, which is currently underway with the hope that it will help inform these decisions in the future. Meanwhile, we cannot risk the economic loss that could be caused by changes that are not adequately studied.

Dear Mr. Lombardo:

This office serves as General Counsel to the San Mateo County Harbor District (District) and your letter of September 15, 2014 regarding the District's March 13, 2013 lease with Pillar Point Seafood (Lease) has been referred to me for a response.

First, you have asserted that the placement of a hoist for Three Captains Sea Products—another of the three wholesalers who have leases with the District—interferes with Pillar Point Seafood's rights to peaceful and undisturbed possession of the leased premises under Section 10.1 of the Lease. The District is unaware of any instances in which the new hoist has ever inconvenienced Pillar Point Seafood's operations, or interfered with its rights under the Lease. Nor did your letter provide any evidence, or even any indication, of any such interference or inconvenience.

Moreover, pursuant to Section 2.1.2 of the Lease, which provision is mirrored in all three of the leases with wholesalers, tenants must cooperate with each other in operating their respective enterprises and may not interfere with each other's operations. Under Section 2.1.2 of the Lease, any claim Pillar Point Seafood would have for such interference must be made against another tenant, not against the District. The District is not responsible for differences or conflicts that may arise between Pillar Point Seafood and other tenant's operations. For this reason alone, the District does not take responsibility for any inconvenience that Pillar Point Seafood allegedly may have suffered.

The placement of the additional hoist—which Three Captains Sea Products, like Pillar Point Seafood, has a right to under Section 9.0(b)(i) of the Lease—was approved by the District's Harbor Master after careful consideration of the location of existing fire protection equipment, the location of the existing freezers, and the needs of the work dock. Locating the hoist at any other location would have required impractical relocation of other facilities, to the detriment of all the lessees, including to Pillar Point Seafood. It is also worth noting that although the Harbor Master may have approved the placement of the hoist, Three Captains Sea Products, under the same lease provision as exists in Pillar Point Seafood's lease, is responsible for obtaining all necessary permits for construction and installation of its hoist. We therefore cannot comment on your assertion that the existing hoist is not properly permitted.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, and consistent with its role as Lessor, the District wishes to help resolve this issue. It therefore pledges that its Harbor Master, consistent with his duties, will continue to manage vessel traffic for the benefit of all lease holders. If there are specific actions that the Harbor Master can take, consistent with his duties, to help resolve what appears to be an issue between tenants, please do not hesitate to ask for his assistance.

Second, you raise an issue concerning fish unloading fees charged by the District under Section 6.1 of the Lease. Your letter refers to "wharfage fees," "landing fees," and "unloading fees." Those terms are not used in the Lease, but we interpret those references all to be to what Section 6.1 of the Lease calls "Fish Off-Loading" fees. You state that "it has been over a year since the District agreed to reconsider its wharfage fees." In fact, at its Board meeting on May 21, 2014, the District adopted a motion that the District would consider a request from a tenant such as Pillar Point Seafood to renegotiate the financial terms of the lease. The District has not received such a request from Pillar Point Seafood, despite the express invitation of the District's Board of Commissioners.

In case your September 15, 2014 letter constitutes a request to renegotiate the financial terms of its lease, the District will respond as it would to any of the three concerned lessess, including Three Captains Sea Products. We reject the implication of the penultimate paragraph of your letter that the District is treating Pillar Point Seafood any differently from any other tenant.

The District is mindful of its obligations as a public agency to maximize the productivity of its enterprise operations. This obligation is of course balanced by a desire to be fair to the entire public, and in particular to charge fees that are reasonable. It was in the spirit of these obligations that the above-referenced Commission action was taken. Please also keep in mind that any amendment(s) to the Lease require, in addition to Harbor Commission approval, the approval of the state Division of Boating and Waterways.

The District believes that the Lease represents a fair and reasonable bargain, entered into after arms-length negotiations and struck to the mutual benefit of both the District and Pillar Point Seafood as of the Commencement Date of the Lease. Presumably, Pillar Point Seafood entered into the Lease because it felt the same. The District is mindful that the term of the Lease is potentially for fifteen years and so its provisions must be viewed with an eye towards a long term relationship.

In keeping with the above, the District requires more information if Pillar Point Seafood would like to request a renegotiation in accordance with the Commission's action. If you would like to pursue this matter further, please provide the following, at a minimum:

- Precisely what Lease term(s) is Pillar Point Seafood seeking to modify?
- What is Pillar Point Seafood's proposal regarding these specific Lease term(s)?
- What is the basis by which Pillar Point Seafood thinks it are entitled to a
 modification in a specified Lease term? If Pillar Point Seafood is suggesting a
 modification to the Fish Off-Loading fee referenced in Section 6.1(b), please
 provide information regarding why it believes this fee is unfair—for instance any

impact on its costs, revenues, and/or profits that would justify a modification to this fee, or to any other specified Lease term.

Is there a benefit to the District that would justify any Lease amendment at this time – or is the request essentially that the District negotiate against itself with nothing in return?

The District values its relationship with Pillar Point Seafood and appreciates the opportunity to respond to the issues raised in your September 15, 2014 letter. I hope this letter is helpful in addressing your client's concerns. Please don't hesitate to contact me directly if you have any questions or would like to discuss further.

A Public Notice for applications for Fish Buying lease locations was issued by the SMCHD on 12/11/11, and the current leaseholders were awarded leases at the 6/6/12 SMCHD meeting. These leases and the fish buying fees associated with them have been the subject of Grand Jury requests, multiple closed session agenda items, and countless public comments over the past 2 ½ years without resolution.

We, the members of the Half Moon Bay Seafood Marketing Association are largely dependent on the fish buying businesses on Johnson Pier for the unloading and marketing of our catch. The sustainability and fairness of these leases for all three fish businesses, both in lease amounts due, and fees applied, have a direct impact on the commercial fishing fleet.

As stated in our letter to the SMCHD presented on July 17, 2013 (attached), we do not support fees that will ultimately be paid by fishermen. We do, however, support the owners of Morning Star Fisheries, Pillar Point Seafood, and Three Captains Seafood as these businesses have supported the fleet for decades. We expect our Harbor District to provide, legal, equitable, competitive and sustainable leases and lease locations for these leaseholders (and for all SMCHD leaseholders).

Unfortunately, based on the handling of this process thus far, we do not have confidence that these leases and fees can be successfully and fairly reviewed without the help of outside negotiators and without oversight to the process.

Therefore we respectfully request that the San Mateo County Harbor District create a transparent process for these leases and fees to be reviewed by an independent party.

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New fish hoist raises concerns at Pillar Point: San Mateo County Harbor District approves fish buyer's request, fishermen don't like it

The installation of a new fish hoist on Johnson Pier in Half Moon Bay Tuesday is drawing suspicion and frustration from a fishermen's group about the San Mateo County Harbor District's construction approval.

District officials, however, contend the hoist installation was done properly and according to lease guidelines though the board president said there could have been more communication.

"If proper outreach wasn't done with other tenants and stakeholders, it's unfortunate," said Robert Bernardo, president of the Harbor District Board of Commissioners. "In this highly, obviously, competitive commercial fishing environment, there's going to be some unhappy people. But here's the thing, we have a lease for which we have a contractual agreement with and we have to abide by that which basically says each tenant can have two hoists wherever they choose, as long as they work with the

District staff had assured fishermen at Pillar Point Harbor there would be consultation with those affected by the location of the hoist owned by a private fish buyer, said Porter McHenry, president of the Half Moon Bay Seafood Marketing Association, which represents more than 20 commercial fisherman.

"They should have just asked the people who it directly affects, their whole life is about being able to unload our fish or our bait or our crab pots, we'd have to move. If it was replacing the same hoist or something minor, OK that's fine, but this is a pretty major change," McHenry said. "They don't seem to really care that much about the fishermen and without the fishermen, the harbor is dead.

The hoist is now one of four on the Johnson Pier and is used to load or unload fish from the boats up to the deck of the pier. There are three fish buyers at the harbor, and each until Tuesday had only one hoist.

The Three Captains Sea Products fish buyer appealed to the district for the installation of its second hoist, said Commissioner Jim Tucker.

"People may be a little bit jealous, people that just overreact to everything. This man had every right to put that hoist in and we made it difficult for him," Tucker said. "The man's entitled to the hoist, we even instructed the general manager to give him a letter for things he had to do to get the hoist and he did it.

Mike McHenry, a fish buyer with Pillar Point Fisheries, said he is upset that one fish buyer received a hoist and doubled the

The allowance of the new hoist stems from the commission, after nearly 20 years, changing the terms of the fish buyer's leases, said General Manager Peter Grenell. Per their lease, each of the three buyers can have two hoists, to be located wherever they choose as long as they work with the harbormaster, Grenell said

Commissioner Sabrina Brennan questions why the fishermen and other stakeholders, who feel they aren't being represented, hadn't been consulted.

"Fishermen want to have input on infrastructure decisions and they should, because they're the ones using the infrastructure and of course the district should be checking with them to see what their needs are," Brennan said

Brennan, Mike McHenry and Porter McHenry refer back to a Jan. 15 commission meeting where they say both Grenell and Harbormaster Scott Grindy assured the board the fishermen would be consulted prior to installing a new hoist

The general manager said he was in support of the public process/strategic planning process at the [Jan. 15] meeting but his actions [Tuesday] make it apparent that backroom deals still rule the day at Pillar Point Harbor. Stakeholders were ignored in favor of the ol' boys club approach to running a public facility," Brennan wrote in an email.

Bernardo said this was no backroom deal as the actions are clearly outlined in the lease agreement. The district must abide by the terms of the lease agreement and "where the hoist goes is between the fish buyer and the harbormaster, it's not up to the community where it goes," Bernardo said.

Yet the primary issue is the location and the district's promise to consult with the stakeholders who have to maneuver around

"The main thing is crab season I think it's going to be the biggest issue. There're 60 or 70 crab boats. It's going to cause a lot of tension, probably slow the boats down, keeping them from making their income, stuck at the dock waiting," McHenry said.

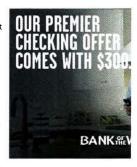
Bernardo and Grenell said physical constraint issues such as this will be discussed as the district looks toward developing its five-year business plan and it will apply for a grant for the plan at the end of the month

Bernardo is hopeful that the new hoist will prove a benefit by expediting fish unloading from which the district will see more fees and the other fish buyers are welcome to appeal for a new hoist as well. As for outreach, it's another thing the district will look toward improving. Bernardo said

"Typically when you're going to make any type of changes to your infrastructure you will send out a courtesy bulletin that tells people this is coming or there's going to be construction here," Bernardo said. "And that type of due diligence is usually done and if it hasn't happened I'm sorry and it's unfortunate it didn't. But we're constantly making improvements so hopefully next time we'll be making better outreach as a district."

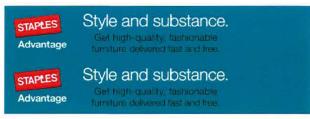

New harbor hoist raises an uproar

A new fishing hoist at the end of the commercial pier at Pillar Point Harbor has rankled the local fishing fleet and bitterly divided a trio of seafood companies.

The private hoist was installed by Three Captains owner Larry Fortado as a way to greatly increase the tonnage of seafood he could unload from docked boats. But Fortado's competitors and a local fishing consortium are crying foul, alleging the new hoist is giving Fortado an unfair advantage and a privileged location on the pier.

The hoist first appeared last week at a narrow dock thoroughfare fronting the fishing companies and all the other unloading equipment at the end of the Johnson Pier. The spot, about 25 feet wide, is too tight for unloading during bustling times like squid

or crab season, according to critics. One semitrailer parked in front of the hoist, they warn, could choke traffic for all the other fish companies.

For his part, Fortado sees those criticisms as the complaints of jealous competitors. He points out that he footed the entire bill for the hoist himself, paying nearly \$40,000 for the installation. Other fishing companies could similarly upgrade if they went through the process, he said.

"They call it a backroom deal — that's just not true," he said. "This is going to benefit everything. It's going to speed up the unloading for crab pots. It's going to speed up everything!"

Harbor denizens first noticed electrical work starting under the pier as early as last year. Spurred by rumors of a new hoist, the 22-member Half Moon Bay Seafood Marketing Association warned in a letter that it should be consulted on the matter. The harbormaster has the sole authority on locating any hoists, freezers or other dock equipment, but harbor officials pledged earlier this year they would confer with the fishing community before taking any actions.

Responding to the letter at a January commission meeting, district General Manager Peter Grenell emphatically denied decisions on a hoist were being made confidentially.

"I take the concerns that we've heard quite seriously," he said. "No one's operating in a black box or a vacuum. That's not how we do business."

Over the next three months, the San Mateo County Harbor District never reached out to the seafood marketing association, said Board President Porter McHenry. Last week, they felt "blindsided" when they saw the hoist being mounted with the district's blessing. The organization later sent a second letter expressing unhappiness.

"They pretty much lied to us," McHenry said. "If there's a boat unloading there, it's going to be hard for any trucks or forklifts to get by. People here are going to start freaking out."

Tensions have been high between harbor officials and some local fishing companies for the last couple years. The owners of Pillar Point Fisheries and Morningstar Fisheries, both Fortado's competitors, have openly criticized new lease agreements they signed with the harbor district in 2012. Along with accepting a 40 percent rent hike, the fishing companies were saddled with new seafood-buying fees that they thought poorly devised.

Fishing company owners say they had little choice in the matter because the harbor district was encouraging a competing bid from local fisherman Geoff Bettencourt. The harbor district rejected Bettencourt's offer in 2012, but he later proposed installing equipment for a fourth fishery lease in the same spot where Fortado's new hoist was mounted. At the time, Grenell told Bettencourt he wasn't interested in the location.

Pillar Point Fisheries owner Mike McHenry — Porter McHenry's father — alleged that Fortado was getting preferential treatment because he didn't join his competitors in voicing his complaints.

"We all pay the same fees. Why should someone get twice the (space)?" he said. "Why should you get the penthouse, when I live in the basement for the same price?"

The recent brouhaha has been a particularly sore point for Morningstar Fisheries owner Dave Mallory. His company's only hoist remains inoperable after falling into the water in February. He blames the accident on a contract firm working for the harbor district. Harbor officials say it is not clear who was at fault in the accident.

Harbor Board Chairman Robert Bernardo believes the recent outrage and distrust simmering among members of the fishing community was the result of bad outreach. He was hopeful for an amenable solution, pointing out the district is applying for a \$3 million grant to upgrade and expand the docks.

"We always strive to improve communication at the harbor," he said. "I was really hopeful that staff could get out there and let people know what's going on there.

"Obviously that didn't happen here," he said.

Thank you for the above-referenced CDP application that we received on September 4, 2014. You are seeking after-the-fact authorization for the installation of a hoist located on Johnson Pier at Pillar Point Harbor, in Half Moon Bay, San Mateo County. Commission staff has reviewed the items in your submittal and determined that the application is incomplete because there is additional information necessary for our review. The application cannot be deemed complete in accordance with the Commission's Administrative Regulations (Title 14 CCR § 13056). We need additional information to facilitate our review of your request for an after-the-fact permit. Please provide the information listed below:

- 1. Appendix D Declaration of Posting. The copy of the Notice of Pending Permit in your submittal lists the California Coastal Commission's North Coast District Office in Arcata as the office where further information can be obtained. This is incorrect; the correct office is the North Central Coast District Office, 45 Fremont Street, Suite 2000. San Francisco, CA 94015. Please re-post the notice (on yellow paper) that includes the North Central Coast District Office address and submit evidence of the posting. I have enclosed the applicable form for you to use.
- 2. Section III, Item 1, Page 4 Present Use of the Property/Site Plan. Please indicate/delineate on the Site Plan: the location of the hoist; the building used by Three Captains, as referenced in item 2 of your application; and other nearby hoists, including the other hoist used by the Three Captains.
- 3. Section III, Item 4, Page 5 Public Access. You indicate that access is located along the shore and on the dock. Please provide a more detailed description of available public access, i.e., the location and the approximate distance from the project site. Further, include a discussion supporting your claim that the project will not affect public access.
- 4. Section III, Items 7 and 9, Page 6 Recreation and Biological Resources. Just to clarify for you, the Commission must ensure that development within the Coastal Zone does not result in negative effects on recreation opportunities. The access you described in your application does not relate to the public's recreational use in the area. Please identify any park or recreation areas near the development.

- 5. Section III, Items 10, Page 6 to 7 Visual Resources. Please identify these locations relative to the project and describe the project's visibility from such locations. State if, and how, the project affects visual resources in the area/vicinity.
- 6. Filing Fee. The subject development was conducted without a permit; therefore you are seeking after-the-fact (A-T-F) authorization to retain the hoist. Fees for A-T-F permit applications shall be five times the regular permit application fee unless the Executive Director reduces the fee to no less than two times the regular permit application fee. The Executive Director may reduce the fee if it is determined that the A-T-F application can be processed by staff without significant additional review time. We have determined that the A-T-F fee for this project can be reduced to two times the regular fee amount. It is possible that this project may also qualify for a waiver. Once we determine how the application will be processed based on the information submitted above, we will let you know the fee amount you are required to submit.

We will hold your application for six months from today's date (i.e., until March 12, 2015) pending receipt of these materials. The application will again be reviewed after all of the above-listed materials have been received, and will be filed as complete if all is in order pursuant to Government Code Section 65943(a). We kindly ask that you submit all of the requested materials at the same time. There may be additional materials necessary for filing purposes dependent upon the nature of the information you provide in response to this letter request.

Please note that if staff does not receive all of the above-listed materials within six months, application number 2-14-1592 will be considered withdrawn and returned to you. This submittal deadline may be extended for good cause if you submit/make a request prior to March 12, 2015. Dear Mr. and Mrs. McHenry, Mr. Fortado, and Mr. Mallory:

On March 5, 2014, the Board of Harbor Commissioners directed staff to send this letter to you regarding your respective fish hoists at your leased premises on Johnson Pier. As you know, you are responsible by the terms of your respective leases for installation, operation, maintenance, and repair of your respective hoists, and for compliance with all applicable laws and regulations regarding hoist inspection, certification, and other safety measures (see attachments) where applicable and for following Cal-OSHA guidelines for all safety aspects of your leased premises and facility.

The Harbor District is aware of the recent incident involving the hoist at Morningstar Fisheries. As provided for in your leases, all lessees must comply with requirements for hoist maintenance and safety, inspection and certification where applicable of your respective hoists. If necessary, you must purchase new hoists at your expense to effect compliance. The Harbor District will work with each of you to facilitate successful hoist inspections regarding safety and other requirements and certification where applicable.

Harbor Master Grindy and I are available to consult with you as needed in this matter. To expedite a successful outcome, I urge you to confer with Grindy or me directly.

Tenant shall have all necessary permits for fish processing on display in order to engage in this activity.
 - (i) Tenant shall provide on the Premises all equipment required for the operation of said wholesale fish dealership, including winch and hoist for the purpose of loading or unloading of fish or other merchandise to and from vessels, and scales, skiff or equipment storage. Tenant may provide a second winch and hoist at a location approved in advance by the Harbor Master.
 - (ii) Tenant shall have the non-exclusive right to sell fish in the same condition as purchased directly from fishing boats at Pillar Point Harbor, on a retail basis, on a month-to-month basis, subject to written approval of Landlord of any plans, specifications and engineering and compliance with San Mateo County Local Coastal Plan and zoning/land use regulations.

 Landlord shall retain the right to delete this right if storage, traffic, pedestrian or space problems occur. Tenant shall not be allowed to do any advertising for the retail fish operation on or off-site at any time except as may be permitted by Landlord at Landlord's sole discretion. Violation of this provision will automatically rescind the right by Tenant to sell fish on a retail basis.
 - (iii) Tenant shall not buy fish or other seafood products from any vessel that exceeds eighty (80) feet in length, without permission of Landlord's Harbor Master or General Manager. Permission shall not be arbitrarily withheld and shall be subject to appeal to the Harbor Commission.
 - (iv) Tenant shall unload at the Premises only fish that it has either purchased or has caught in vessels owned or leased by Tenant, or has been purchased by a registered holder of a valid Commercial Activity Permit issued by Landlord. There will be no fish processing on the second floor of the Premises.
 - (v) Tenant shall provide documentation to the District for all fish unloaded that has been purchased by a registered holder of a valid Commercial Activity Permit issued by Landlord, which documentation shall include

- (d) Tenant's rights to buy fish shall be non-exclusive, and Landlord retains the right to permit the purchase of fish from vessels at Pillar Point Harbor. Tenant shall annually negotiate in good faith with other tenants at Pillar Point and local fisherman to establish a commercially reasonable pricing schedule for fish purchases. To the extent such agreement on pricing is reached and implemented each year, Landlord shall include in any permits that it issues for fish purchases from vessels a Fee equal to that required in subsection 6.1(a) of this Lease.
- 9.2 <u>Limitations on Use</u>. Tenant's activities on the Premises shall be in accordance with this Paragraph 9.2.
- 9.2.1 <u>Prohibited Uses</u>. The parties hereto agree that the following acts, occurrences or conduct by Tenant on or from the Premises are strictly prohibited:
 - (a) Engaging in, assisting, aiding or abetting in any act that constitutes a violation of any Law.
 - (b) Obstructing vessel or vehicle traffic on Harbor waters or land area.
- 9.2.2 Compliance with Laws and Legal Requirements. Tenant, at Tenant's sole cost and expense, promptly shall comply with all Laws, statutes, ordinances, resolutions, regulations, judicial decisions, proclamations, orders, decrees or policies of any municipal, county, state or federal government, or the departments, courts, commissions, boards and officers thereof, or other governmental or regulatory authority with jurisdiction over the Tenant and the Premises or any portion thereof, including without limitation, the Landlord, relating to or affecting the condition, use or occupancy of the Premises in effect either at the time of execution of this Lease or which may hereafter be in effect at any time during the term hereof, whether or not the same are now contemplated by the parties. Tenant's compliance shall include compliance with all provisions and conditions of the Federal Americans with Disabilities Act and California Harbors and Navigation Section 40. Tenant shall obtain and pay for all licenses and permits required for Tenant's construction and occupancy and use of the Premises. Compliance with Laws and Legal Requirements shall include compliance with all requirements of each regulatory agency that has jurisdiction over the Premises including but not limited to the Department of Boating and Waterways and the County of San Mateo.

Landlord makes no representation or warranty with respect to the condition of the Premises, including without limitation, the seismological condition thereof, or their fitness or availability for any particular use, and Landlord shall not be liable for any latent or patent defect therein.
 - 14.3 Tenant's Maintenance Obligations.
 - (a) Tenant shall, at all times during the Term of this Lease, at its sole cost and expense, keep the Premises in Good Condition and maintained in good working order and condition, and repair the Premises and all Improvements and Alterations thereon, including water, electric, and gas lines located inside the Premises. Tenant shall provide routine custodial Maintenance of the Premises, which includes all ordinary housekeeping and maintenance of equipment and replacement of supplies that are normally performed on a day-to-day basis in order to keep the Premises operating in an efficient, clean, safe, and Good Condition. Routine maintenance includes, but is not limited to:
 - (i) Replacing light bulbs as needed where no specialized equipment is required to do so.
 - (ii) Regular cleaning of the area, storage spaces, and regular washing of windows to be done not less than weekly; daily removal of interior and exterior graffiti, and daily emptying of trash receptacles and ash trays.
 - (b) At least once each quarter, representative(s) of Tenant responsible for supporting and overseeing operations of the Premises shall meet with representative(s) of Landlord and inspect the Premises and confer on status of operations and possible improvements.

- (c) Tenant shall be responsible, at its sole expense, for all interior building repairs, including repairs to exterior doors. Tenant shall also be responsible for repairing, at its sole expense, all damage to ladders, piers and fender pilings caused by any vessel using Harbor facilities to access the Premises in connection with Tenant's operations. A video will be given to Tenant prior to the Commencement Date to establish the baseline state of conditions.
- (d) Landlord shall not be obligated to make any repairs, replacement or renewals of any kind, nature or description whatsoever to the Premises nor to any Improvements or alterations now or hereafter located thereon, except that Landlord shall maintain the outside and roof of the structure containing the Leased Premises, including painting the outside of the structure.
- (e) In the event that the Tenant, its agent or invitees cause any Damages (excepting ordinary wear and tear) to the Premises, Landlord may repair the same at Tenant's expense and Licensee shall immediately reimburse Landlord therefor. Tenant shall make or cause others to make all repairs, replacements or renewals, whether interior or exterior, structural or non-structural, ordinary or extraordinary, foreseen or unforeseen, necessary or appropriate to maintain the Premises in Good Condition. Tenant shall provide and maintain established standards of public health and cleanliness established by Landlord.
- (f) In the event Tenant fails to maintain the Premises in Good Condition as required by this Paragraph 14, Landlord may give Tenant written notice specifying what actions are required to correct the conditions of the Premises. In the event Tenant fails to initiate such actions as are indicated by Landlord in its notice within thirty (30) days after Tenant's receipt of such notice, or thereafter fails to diligently proceed to complete such actions, such failure shall be deemed an Event of Default within the meaning of Paragraph 21 and Landlord shall have all the rights, powers and remedies provided for in this Lease or at Law including the right to enter on the Premises and maintain or cause the Maintenance of the Premises as required by this Paragraph 14. In such event Landlord shall be entitled to reimbursement for any amounts spent plus a fee of ten percent (10%) of the cost of the work performed which shall be due and payable five (5) days after Tenant receives Landlord's statement therefore. In the event Tenant fails to pay such amounts within such five (5) day period, Landlord shall be entitled to interest thereon at the Default Rate established in Section 21.4 from the end of such five (5) days until paid.
- 14.4 <u>Common Maintenance and Landscaping Program</u>. If Landlord shall, after the Effective Date, implement a program for the common Maintenance and landscaping of common areas situated near the Premises, Tenant agrees to enter into an agreement with Landlord and Landlord's other tenants, as appropriate, implementing such a program and to pay its proportionate share of expenses.

- (b) In the event of any major emergency or condition (i.e., power outage, flooding, fire, natural catastrophe or any other unanticipated condition) that may reasonably result in a threat to Persons or property, Tenant shall immediately contact Landlord by telephone and Tenant's Manager or Assistant Manager shall report to the Premises and remain until the emergency has been resolved. If Landlord cannot be reached, Tenant shall make continued efforts to reach other staff persons as designated by Landlord until a Landlord representative has been notified. To Harbor Commissioners:

Three Captains is the longest continuous business at the Pier and has been giving great service to boats since 1981. During the negotiation for the new lease, I had a meeting with the Harbor Manager, Peter Granelli about the disadvantages Three Captains' Sea Products had in regards to unloading compared to the two other buyers. He assured me that he would share that concern with the Harbor Commissioner and get back to me. At the next meeting with Peter Granelli, I was told that the Harbor Commissioners had visited the Pier and took my concern under consideration and said "it was a no brainer" and that they agreed to give me a new location for a second hoist, in a different place other than behind the building with no expense to the Harbor.

After the lease was signed, I was told I could start on the hoist. I had the galvanized hoist built to the standard which would improve the look of the Harbor. I also got the permit for the electricity and the hoist was ready to go. To my surprise, I was told to place the hoist on hold. This was not the first time I was told to put the hoist on hold. After receiving the go ahead, on three separate occasions I was told to put the work on hold.

The hoist was supposed to go up before the crab season and it is now 2 ½ months into crab season! When the second hoist was approved at the new location, I assured my boats that unloading would be easier, faster, safer and more convenient to them as it is currently a struggle. I was not able to keep my

promise to the boats. I am still on hold. It is not fair for anyone to be treated this way when there is a

demand for unloading it is not a good business decision.

This has caused me a lot of mental stress, has been an inconvenience and loss of money. I have

already put \$30,000 to \$35,000 into this hoist. I have not taken any legal action as of yet and I

sincerely hope I won't be forced to do so.

The new hoist will expedite the unloading and will make the Harbor less congested and bring in more

revenue. I request you remove the hold on the hoist and keep to the agreement we made.

As called for by the Board of Harbor Commissioners, following is information on hoists at Pillar Point Harbor, including Johnson Pier.

Existing Hoists on Johnson Pier:

At this time there are five hoists on Johnson Pier. These are all provided, owned, operated, and maintained by three commercial wholesale fish unloaders and buyers. Pillar Point Seafood has two, Three Captains Sea Products has two (although one is inoperative), and Morningstar Fisheries has one. The hoists are used for unloading fish caught by commercial fishermen, either home-ported at Pillar Point or from other harbors.

Lease Requirements Regarding Hoists:

The three commercial fishing operations on Johnson Pier each hold a lease from the Harbor District. Each lease requires the following:

9.1 <u>Use</u> (b)(i): "Tenant shall provide on the Premises all equipment required for the operation of said wholesale fish dealership, including

winch and hoist for the purpose of loading or unloading of fish or other merchandise to and from vessels, and scales, skiff or equipment storage. Tenant may provide a second winch and hoist at a location approved in advance by the Harbor Master."

14.3 <u>Tenant's Maintenance Obligations</u>: This lease section provides that the tenant shall be responsible at its sole expense for maintenance of the leased premises including improvements and equipment, except that the District shall maintain the outside and roof of the building containing the leased premises.

Hoist Certification:

State law requires that hoists be regularly inspected and certified by the appropriate authority. This is the responsibility of the hoist owner. Copies of hoist certifications must be given to the Harbor Master.

District's Public Hoist:

The Harbor District maintains a public hoist on shore near the Harbor office, above a skiff dock. This facility is available to the general public. This hoist is key fob operated and slip-holder users are billed on their slip rent bills. Non-slip holders have the harbor patrol activate the hoist and track time used.

Johnson Pier Deck Planning for Improved Operations:

The Johnson Pier has been recognized by its users and the District as congested and inefficient in its function as a fish unloading facility. This results from its limited deck area and design, and multiple uses including public access to the pier and to its five docks and limited vehicle parking for slip tenants.

A 1994 study commissioned by the District identified three pier expansion alternatives, particularly at the outer portion of the pier used by commercial fishing operations. These alternatives showed widening of deck area along outer and inner pier areas. High estimated improvement costs and no available funding resulted in no remedial action at that time.

The District is again considering ways to improve fishing operations on the pier. Relocation of some of the freezer capacity is being examined; retention of bait storage on the pier probably is needed, however. More substantially, the feasibility of possible limited expansion of deck area to enable more efficient and safe truck operation is being considered. Feasibility of expanded hoist provision and location is part of this inquiry. The leases provide that a tenant may provide another hoist at a location approved in advance by the Harbor Master.

Facilities Condition Survey:

The District has begun a comprehensive Facilities Condition Survey at both Pillar Point Harbor and Oyster Point Marina. This survey will update the previous survey done several years ago. The survey will include condition of the Johnson Pier and related District facilities and structures. The survey outcome may have implications for use of hoists on the pier.

Strategic Business Plan:

The Facilities Condition Survey will be a direct input to the District's multi-year Strategic Business Plan, which will get under way in 2014. As part of the Business Plan's Pillar point component, a fisheries sustainability plan linked with a facilities needs analysis will be included. This will consider improvements, expansion, and economic, physical, and environmental feasibility of fishing infrastructure including hoists.

Grand Jurors:

On behalf of Bettencourt Fisheries, we respectfully request that you convene an inquiry into the operation of the Pillar Point Harbor by the San Mateo County Harbor District. The Commissioners of the District are Pietro Paravanno, James Tucker, Robert Bernardo, Sabrina Brennan and William Hollsinger the General Manager of the District is Peter Grennel.

The specific operations, policies and programs to be investigated are the management of Johnson Pier in Pillar Point Harbor, and specifically the award of leases for commercial operations on the pier.

The investigation is necessary and appropriate because substantial credible information, provided with this letter, demonstrates that the Commissioners and General Manager have mismanaged the award of leases to businesses using the Johnson Pier. This has resulted in significant economic loss to the District. It has caused significant damage to competition among service providers who operate on public facilities. And, it has destroyed business opportunities for those who desire to offer additional services.

Bettencourt Fisheries proposes this investigation. It is a local family commercial fishing business that has operated in Half Moon bay for more than 100 years. As the accompanying materials explain, when the District invited proposals for leases in early 2012, Bettencourt was the <u>only</u> business to propose lease terms which met the minimum required rental. Bettencourt not only submitted the only compliant bid, it proposed improvements to public facilities, which would have provided significant benefits to the public. Nonetheless, the District determined to award leases to incumbent proposers who refused to pay the minimum rent specified. The result has been both lessening of competition and significant loss of revenue.

Concerns about the operation of the Harbor District are not new. The 2001 Civil Grand Jury reported that:

"There is, however, major dissension among the Commissioners. There has been refusal to participate in discussion of, and vote upon, some issues, and frequent airing of complaints outside Commission meetings. This dissension distracts the Commissioners and the District Manager from properly conducting District

business. For example, some of the District leases, entered into some years ago, are not providing optimum revenue.

Recommendations were:

- 1. District Commissioners should develop a better working relationship in order to better govern the District.
- 2. The District should engage a qualified consultant to help Commissioners develop conflict resolution skills.
- 3. The District should publicize its successes to counter current unfavorable publicity.
- 4. The District should seek opportunities to improve terms of its leases to generate more income."

Despite a recommendation made more than 12 years ago, the District has failed and refused to improve the terms of its leases and, worse, has submitted to pressure from incumbent lease holders to continue to provide them with low cost rents – below the minimum amount specified by the District when the current round of lease renewals took place.

Substantial documentation confirms the improprieties in the lease awards. Both Lisa Damrosch and Geoff Bettencourt are available to provide specifics.

Enclosed as Exhibits A¹ and B² for your review is a newspaper article which provides some background. It is significant, we believe, that Bettencourt has been a leader in working with environmental groups to reduce the impact of ground fishing off the San Mateo coast. This involvement has specifically surfaced as a factor in the discussions concerning renewal of the leases. If the District has given undue deference to the desires of "traditional" high impact fishing interests in denying the Bettencourt application, it should be a matter of particular concern to the Grand Jurors.

A timeline of events surrounding the award of leases is attached hereto as Exhibit C and is summarized as follows:

A public notice was issued December 8, 2011 specifying that the minimum annual rental would be not less than \$3,000 per month and setting a deadline for lease applications of February 23, 2012. Bettencourt timely submitted its lease package and filing fee. There were three incumbent lease holders, each of whom has enjoyed the use of public facilities for a significant time. All three requested renewal. Bettencourt was the only proposer who submitted a competing proposal.

The Four proposals submitted were made public. Comparison shows clearly that Bettencourt was the only proposer to comply with the minimum rent term.

The Bettencourt Package was the only package to offer a 100+ year family history, a plan for marketing and branding, support for sustainable and environmentally friendly fishing, expanded market opportunities for the fleet, and careful and accurate reporting using the latest technology. None of the other applicants offered any of these things.

The application by Bettencourt created significant tension. Audio of the April 18, 2012 Harbor Commission meeting confirms the late Commissioner Padreddi stated: "My feeling was that this was going to be an easy negotiation, we were just going to renew the leases and everyone was going to be happy. But now all of a sudden, stuff is coming out". During the May 2, 2012 meeting President Tucker expressed frustration, and asked General Manager Grenell if he was too close to negotiate successfully. Tucker confirmed that there were four applicants and that "one applicant is on board and has met all requirements and the other 3 have not met them". Commissioner Tucker stated three times on the record that the Bettencourt Proposal was the only compliant proposal.

Nonetheless, on May 30, 2012, Mr. Grennel recommended awarding the leases to the three incumbent applicants. Beginning in June 2012 and until November 2012, Bettencourt attempted to work with the General Manager for a resolution which would have resulted in the creation of a fourth lease that would not displace incumbent tenants but that would increase District revenue significantly. The General Manager alternately refused to meet and professed interest in the proposal, but ultimately rejected it out of hand. At the same time, the District did not execute the three leases which had been awarded. Almost nine months passed (during which revenues were lost because the new leases were not in force) but on March 12, 2013 Mike McHenry (Pillar Point Seafood), Larry Fortado (Three Captains Sea Products), and Dave Mallory (Morning Star Fisheries) each signed their respective leases with the District for premises on Johnson Pier. Bettencourt has worked hard to repair relationships damaged by the Harbor negotiations of 2012 during which they were used as a threat and bargaining tool against the incumbents. The Bettencourts do not desire to harm the businesses currently in place, but they do believe the District should be held accountable for its mismanagement.

The Bettencourts believe that the mismanagement is not limited to the District's leasing operations. For example, attached as Exhibit D³ is a recent newspaper article which concludes that District commissioner compensation is markedly out of step with other county organizations. As noted in the article, the District commissioners receive compensation and benefits well above that of other local governing bodies.

Bettencourt believes investigation will confirm significant mismanagement of the Pillar Point Harbor including lost and foregone revenue and suppression of competition among users of the public pier. Bettencourt believes investigation will confirm that it is not the only business damaged by poor management of this Harbor District. Simply put, after

Fourth generation commercial fisherman Geoff Bettencourt says he never had a chance" when applying for one of the three open fish leases on Johnson Pier in Pillar Point Harbor.

A superior economic package from a family with 120 years in this community was brushed aside in favor of entrenched interests who were able to convince the Harbor Commission to turn down additional revenues," he said. One would have to ask if this Harbor Commission will ever allow anything to improve at Pillar Point Harbor."

The San Mateo County Harbor District's general manager Peter Grenell says anyone had a chance through a proposal process that invited interested parties to apply for leasing one of the three open facilities used for fish buying and off loading.

In December of 2011, the San Mateo County Harbor District issued a public notice requesting interested parties to submit proposals since the current leases for Pillar Point Seafood, Morningstar Fisheries and Three Captains Sea Products had expired. They received four proposals, one from the Bettencourt's and three from the existing leaseholders.

In the end, it was decided that Pillar Point Seafood, Morningstar Fisheries and Three Captains Sea Products would continue as

Currently the leases are being reviewed by each of the three firms awarded the leases from the Harbor Commission. The leases will then be forwarded to the Department of Boating and Waterways (DBW) with the Harbor Commission's request for their review and approval. Once that is given by DBW, the leases will be signed.

During these challenging economic times, the Harbor Commission felt the need to reaffirm its commitment to sustaining the diversity and stability of Pillar Point fisheries and fishing activity, while obtaining increased revenues from existing and new sources," said Grenell. The Harbor Commission decided that renewing our relationship with the existing leaseholders is the best way to accomplish these goals."

Still, the Bettencourt's assert that there was some other agenda at play here," said Lisa Bettencourt-Damrosch, who drafted the proposal for the lease with her brother Geoff.

Even though Bettencourt Fisheries fully complied with the application and was the only package that met the minimum lease amount required per the public notice, offered an investment for improvements to the space, had 120-year fishing family history, a plan for marketing and branding, support for sustainable and environmentally friendly fishing, expanded market opportunities for the fleet, and careful and accurate reporting using the latest technology, we never had a chance," said Bettencourt-Damrosch.

My brother Geoff Bettencourt and I did everything we possibly could to provide the harbor with the best possible option, economic and otherwise, and as is clear in the record, that we did provide the best option and still we were not given a lease."

Bettencourt-Damrosch attributes a loyalty to the individuals who have been leasing at the pier for many years, multiple negotiations with the existing tenants that excluded them, and a desire to retain longer term leases to sell as major reasons why the Bettencourt's believe they were overlooked when applying for a fish lease on the pier.

When a public notice is issued with requirements that are suddenly changed without an additional public notice, when closed door sessions are held and votes that take up to six months are reached without discussion, and when an economically and otherwise superior package that has by all accounts met and exceeded all original requirements can be passed over for non-compliant entrenched interests, someone needs to stand up," said Bettencourt-Damrosch.

Still, before awarding any leases, the Harbor Commission, according to sections in the State Harbors and Navigational Code, has two options: except the highest bid for filling the spots or provide a proposal and negotiating process.

They opted for the proposal process, which gives no direction or guidance other than the implication that you will decide who is awarded the lease," said Grenell.

Why did they opt for the proposal process as opposed to the highest bid?

Because we need to consider the best interest of the harbor and in a highest bid process we lose our flexibility and control over ensuring the safety and wellbeing of the harbor," said Greneli.

He's referring to the fact that with the highest bid, we will be stuck by law to take on that hirer bid even if they don't comply with the physical limitations of the pier and its arrangement," he said.

Traffic congestion and safety become a huge factor to consider as fish lessees jockey for space. Anyone can come in and decide to unload fish for a period of time, and then turn around and start buying.

We can only have so many out there doing the same thing. The bid process does not allow us to manage what fish lessees do and how they do it so that s why we opted for the proposal process," he said.

He also wonders why the Harbor Commission with a \$1.4 million debt to the Department of Boating and Waterways wouldn't want the highest bid to generate revenue.

We offered a significant investment into facility improvements the other three proposals did not," said Bettencourt. Our proposal also offered the possibility of a new and additional revenue stream such as expanding market opportunities for the fleet."

Grenell says there was a lot more to their decision than looking to generate revenue. He admits that higher leases would indeed help pay off loans but the Harbor is already increasing their revenue sources in other ways so this gives us another reason to not go for the highest bid," he said.

New revenue streams for the Harbor include unloading fees, and under a new ordinance code, the Harbor District has implement a commercial buyer activity permit so non-lessees will have to apply for an annual permit before buying on the pier.

Up until now, we never received revenue from those off-site buyers or fish unloaders, but we will now," said Grenell.

In addition, the Bettencourt's only wanted to unload fish and we can only have one out there because of the physical safety issues on the pier. It would be too much chaos out here," he said.

Also, said Grenell, with the Bettencourt proposal there were too many variables of uncertainty, including the Harbor Commission's responsibility to maintaining fish diversity in the harbor when it comes to the individual fishing quotas (IFQ) catch share system, which has been challenged in federal court.

A highly regulated federal government program, IFQs set a species-specific total allowable catch (TAC), typically by weight and for a given time period. A dedicated portion of the TAC, called quota shares, is allocated to individuals. Quotas can typically be bought, sold and leased, a feature called transferability.

Uncertainty arises as to what happens if the chailenge is upheld. While the Bettencourt proposal clearly says that Bettencourt would unload catch from any fishery, not just ground fish, the proposal focuses on establishing a ground fish unloading station at Pillar Point Harbor," said Grenell.

Still, it might work for Bettencourt to be the only first receiver unloader for IFQ ground fish but the IFQ system limits participation in the fishery, and thus may reduce local fishing activity," said Grenell.

This contrasts with a community fishing association (CFA) alternative, in which the association would hold the quota that would be available to a wider range of participants. The formation of a CFA at Pillar Point Harbor is being talked about, said Grenell, and would sustain a wider community access to the fishery and would be important for the Pillar Point fishing industry and its participants.

Under this approach, quota would be assigned to the association and thus available to all of its members, in contrast to the individual assignments of IFQs. It s not certain, but if a CFA were to be formed and sought quota, that might be more difficult to obtain if an IFQ operation were already in place," he said.

Yet the Bettencourt's continue to explore options with the Harbor.

Last week they requested a meeting with Grenell to share a proposal with a solution. They would like to see a fourth location created on the pier, a progressive and viable solution to this whole problem," said Bettencourt-Damrosch.

As a family that has been unloading to this dock since it was built, we are clear on what is possible within the space, and we are willing to create and fund this solution ourselves," she said.

Grenell is aware of their idea but because the Bettencourt's

In the meantime, the Bettencourt's remain hopeful that the Harbor Commission will meet with us and resolve this with a reevaluation of their decision," said Bettencourt-Damrosch, "or a new alternative as we have tried to propose."

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Fishery blasts harbor over lease process

Applicant offered more money

For the last 120 years the Bettencourt family has made a living as part of the Coastside fishing community, but

now, for the first time ever, family members say they feel like pariahs at Pillar Point Harbor.

The family rolled the dice last year, hoping to grow its seafood business, Bettencourt Fisheries, by applying to rent a space at the end of the Johnson Pier. That set up the family for a fight with Morningstar, Three Captains and Pillar Point Seafood, three fishing companies that have occupied the harbor s spaces for decades.

The harbor s three commercial buildings operate as seafood marketplaces, providing a location for fishing companies to buy the catch of independent fishermen or store their own stock. The buildings are also used to sell the seafood to wholesalers or individual customers.

Now, after seven months of trying to sell themselves as model tenants, the Bettencourts believe they we been competing in a rigged match run by the San Mateo County Harbor District. Earlier this month, the Harbor Commission rejected the Bettencourts application, choosing instead to sign new leases with its longstanding

That decision came as a shock to the Bettencourts. They say they tried to go above and beyond what the harbor requested, offering to pay \$800 more each month than their competitors. They also pledged to adhere to stricter sustainable fishing standards and invest \$60,000 in repairs to their



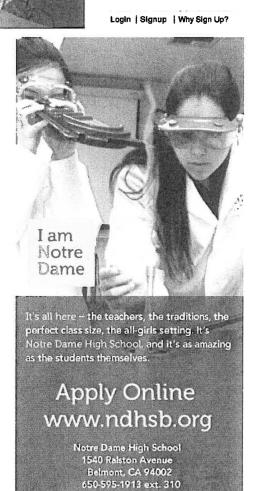

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building space.



-We thought we had a chance at this, and it turns out we didn t," said co-owner Lisa Bettencourt-Damrosch. -We could ve offered them anything, but clearly they were going to give the lease to the other three."

Under other circumstances, the harbor would have been compelled to select Bettencourt Fisheries as the highest return on investment for a taxpayer-funded government agency. But this wasn t a normal bid process, said harbor General Manager Peter Grenell. The Harbor District instead used a special provision of Section 72.2 of the California Harbor and Navigation Code, which allowed the district much more flexibility to choose its business partners.

-We felt it was the most appropriate and useful process to go through, "Grenell said. -The (Bettencourts) may think they should get it because they offered more money, but it s not a bid process."

The lease battle first started in December when the harbor district publicized it was accepting new tenants. In its public notice, the harbor listed the new minimum rent at \$3,000 a month plus new fees for unloading fish and seafood sales. Previously, the district reportedly charged about \$2,100 a month, and the longstanding fishing tenants balked at having their rent jump by nearly a third.

The Bettencourts say they felt the ire of the other fishing companies, after they upped the bar by offering to pay \$3,300 a month. Bettencourt-Damrosch remembers the harbor district staff and the commissioners encouraging them to stay in the running,

Last month as the district prepared to choose tenants, Bettencourt-Damrosch said she was certain her family would get one of the spaces. Harbor Commission Chairman Jim Tucker noted at the time that the Bettencourts were the only party that actually followed the applications minimum guidelines.

But earlier this month, Grenell made clear he preferred to stick with the three current tenants. In a staff report written to the harbor commission, he suggested the Bettencourt company could try to monopolize by buying up fishing rights. His allegation was based on the Bettencourt's participation in the Groundfish Rationalization Program, a relatively new government-run program that assigns fishing quotas to senior fishermen. The quotas can then be traded or sold.

-Basically, this opens the door to some entity or person going after quotas and in the end reducing the number of people who are fishing, "Grenell said. -There could a chain of economic impacts."

That logic is -seriously flawed" countered Geoff Bettencourt, saying that would mean he was being unfairly penalized because he joined a sustainable fishing program. Groundfish was only one part of his business, he explained, and he also dealt in crab, salmon and other species.

-it makes no sense ... the only thing we can think is that they don t want us in the harbor because of our environmental ties," he said. -We spent seven months in this process because we thought it was fair, and they used me like a pawn."

Grenell instead proposed signing new leases with the three current tenants for \$2,500 a month amount \$500 less than the district originally listed as its minimum rent.

Commissioners Pietro Parravano and William Holsinger earlier this month recused themselves from voting. The remaining three unanimously approved the staff recommendation, echoing the need to uphold -diversity" at the harbor.

-We ve done business with the existing three tenants, and I didn't feel that this was the right time to jump ship," said Commissioner Robert Bernardo. -Obviously we re going through tough economic times, and the way I approached it was we needed to reaffirm our commitment to stability and sustaining diversity."

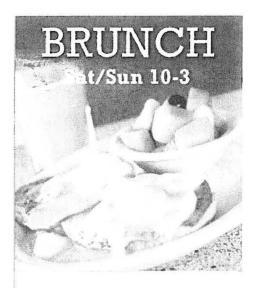
Chairman Tucker went along with that reasoning, even though he said that at face value the Bettencourts made a better offer.

-We had these incumbent lease owners, and I felt that we owed loy alty to them," he said. -If we wanted to bring in the Bettencourts, it would have been good for us, but which one of the three tenants do we throw out?"

The Bettencourts now believe they were kept in the running to provide leverage to prod the old tenants to accept a higher rent. They have forwarded their complaints on the lease process to the state Department of Boating and Waterways, which has final approval on the lease process.

-Relationships that we ve had for 40 years have been damaged because of this," said Bettencourt-Damrosch. -That s the fallout for us from this."

A Boating and Waterway official said the department is currently investigating the matter.

A review of compensation practices among nine governing bodies that serve the Coastside shows that the San Mateo County Harbor District, which is responsible for both Oyster Point Marina and Pillar Point Harbor, offers its commissioners pay and benefits that dwarf those of any other district.

Typically, local government boards pay their governing members a token stipend of one hundred dollars per meeting with no other benefits beyond limited expense reimbursement (in the cases where members are required to travel on government business).

For example, the Coastside Fire Protection District, a local government agency with a multi-million dollar budget and several dozen emergency personnel under its contract with Cal Fire, pays directors one hundred dollars a meeting with a maximum payment of \$400 a month a maximum that, to my knowledge, hasn't been reached in at least five years, if ever. In 2011, a time period with an unusually high number of meetings, the total annual expense per director was \$1600.

The Midcoast Community Council ranks as the least compensated local governing body. MCC directors receive -zero zip nada not even gas mileage reimbursement* according to council member Lisa Ketchum. According to Ketchum, however, the county does offer members the countesy of free parking in the county parking structure in Redwood City if they are visiting on official MCC business.

The Half Moon Bay City Council pays its members three hundred dollars on a monthly basis with no health or retirement benefits.

In what is perhaps the most innovative compensation arrangement on the coast, the Cabrillo Unified School Board doesn't pay its board members or offer them paid benefits. But it does allow them, at the full cost of the premiums, to buy health insurance in the school employee health and welfare program. This appears to offer members a significant benefit (if they have no other coverage) while not incurring any costs for the school district.

Dwarfing all other agencies sening the Coastside, the San Mateo County Harbor District offers its commissioners generous and extensive pay, health and retirement plans. Each commissioner receives an automatic stipend of six hundred dollars per month, whether they attend meetings or not. Total cost this fiscal year? \$36,000.

The members of the commission enjoy the benefits of the \$42,801 allotted to health insurance this fiscal year, covering the five members. Commissioners are also covered by workers compensation insurance (\$2400 in the current year) and receive the benefits of an -Employment Assistance Program,* budgeted at \$542.

Retirees from the commission can rely on financial support from the commission. Although it is not clear whether the insurance offered by the Harbor District is available to new members or just to the two longest serving members and their families (who are grandfathered in) and the retirees, the District has set aside nearly \$20,000 a year to cover these expenses.

And it goes on and on. Meetings, travel, and training run \$8300. Mileage reimbursement? \$400. Employee appreciation dinner? \$3750.

All told, the compensation of the commissioners at the Harbor District appears to not only be larger than the costs of the other eight governing bodies combined, it appears to cost twice as much as all eight other districts combined even before you add in the nearly \$20,000 for the retired commissioners.

The Harbor District commissioners will be meeting to discuss their budget on Wednesday, May 1st and again on June 5th, both meetings at 7:00 pm at the Comfort Inn on Highway One. They will also soon be appointing a new member to replace to the late Leo Padreddii, who passed away two weeks ago.

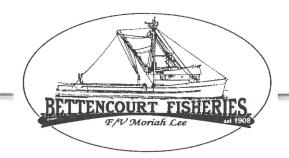

Dear Mr Grenell:

This letter is to follow up to our letter of 8/8/12 and the proposal by Bettencourt Fisheries for a fourth Johnson Pier lease that was submitted on 8/22/12. Please inform us in writing within one week whether or not you intend to enter into negotiations to finalize a lease.

It has been more than ten years since the San Mateo County Civil Grand jury recommended that the harbor seek opportunities to improve the terms of its leases to generate more income. The final 2001 Grand jury report included the following:

"There is, however, major dissension among the Commissioners. There has been refusal to participate in discussion of, and vote upon, some issues, and frequent airing of complaints outside Commission meetings. This dissension distracts the Commissioners and the District Manager from properly conducting District business. For example, some of the District leases, entered into some years ago, are not providing optimum revenue."

Frankly, it seems that nothing has changed since the last Grand Jury investigation. It appears that the district waited 10 years to post a public notice that would implement the Grand Jury recommendation that "The District should seek opportunities to improve terms of its leases to generate more income" and then the District did not adhere to the terms of that public notice, or make the most economically sound choice for awarding leases.

We have consistently offered better economics and terms, and continue to offer an enhanced opportunity for a fourth revenue generating location, to which you have so far refused to respond to. Neither we, nor the public has ever been given any substantial reason for the refusal to award a lease, which is clearly in the best interests of the County.

We remain willing and interested to negotiate and finalize a lease and to execute a full and complete release of all claims against all persons and public entities connected with this matter.

Please give us your prompt response.

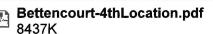

Bettencourt Fisheries

We are the fourth generation of a Princeton-by-the-Sea commercial fishing family and are current owners and operators of the successful fishing vessel *Moriah Lee*. We would like to create a brand new professionally operated unloading facility, which will focus on sustainability and traceability and be founded on the values of our historic family—honor, respect, integrity, and fairness.

We remain committed to our vision of a Pillar Point Harbor based business, that marries our deep connections to the honor and hard work that this Harbor was built on, with forward-thinking, sustainable minded and environmentally conscious business practices.

History shows that Johnson Pier has supported 4 fish buying stations in the past. We would like to operate a fourth, smaller location to operate as an un-loader and buyer for the local fleet. A fourth location will provide additional revenue to the harbor.

Location:

- □ We believe that there are several potential sites for a fourth location on the pier.
- ☐ Aerial photos from the San Mateo Harbor website, and Google Maps reflect large amount of space between the fish buyer's building and the work dock ramp.
- Currently within this space are 2 working freezers (Morning Star and Pillar Point) the rest of the space is non-operational, an eyesore, not maintained and not revenue generating.
- ☐ This space does not reflect a professional working harbor as has been identified as a Commission goal.





- □ Both photos also show a third freezer that is on the dock to the South, this is the Three Captains operational freezer.
- ☐ We are initially presenting 2 options for consideration, but are open to more possibilities.

Option 1-No Freezers on the dock. (See Attachment 1 and 2)

- □ Up and down the coast dock space is at a premium, therefore freezers are often located off of the pier, in parking lots etc. Moving the 3 working freezers off of Johnson Pier will free up 480 square feet of dock space.
- ☐ Freezers on the dock contribute to traffic and congestion, especially during busy seasons. Moving freezers off of the dock will reduce foot traffic and pick up truck traffic significantly.
- ☐ We estimate that moving the non-working freezers and broken buildings would at least double this available space.
- ☐ In this scenario, Bettencourt Fisheries would occupy (3) 8'x20' containers for office and working space for a total of 480 square feet of interior space

Option 2-No Freezers on the dock. (See Attachment 3 and 4)

- ☐ If it is necessary to keep freezers on the dock, there is still a significant amount of unused space in that area of the dock.
- ☐ In this scenario, Bettencourt Fisheries would occupy (2) 8'x20' containers for office and working space, for a total of 320 square feet of interior space

	In either of these possibilities, the gangway/walkway to the working dock would need to move from the North end to the South End
	Both possibilities would require power to buildings.
	Both options require positioning/cribbing. It appears that construction is underway to repair rotted cribbing under old structures, this would be a minor extension of that work.
	We request that all exterior spaces be equal between all 4 leaseholders
	We request storage spaces be striped and clearly marked.
	We request that vehicles other than forklifts are not allowed past the turn around point on the pier. This will allow all 4 leaseholders to operate more efficiently. We would like to work with the Harbor staff and/or commissioners to explore
	which of these options are most feasible based on other improvement plans that may be underway. We are also open to discussing other options that may be available to us.
Buildi	ng:
	Our vision is for the building space to be portable 8'x20' container buildings, which would expedite permitting issues and avoid costly construction.
	Bettencourt Fisheries would be willing to fund the building(s) as part of our agreement with the harbor if other terms can be agreed upon.
	We can be operational with the same space that two 8x20 Freezers occupy as seen in Option 2. We would prefer Option 1, which would allow for an additional 8x20 space for our operation and be a more efficient use of the total space.
	We would intend to brand this building with the Bettencourt name. We would find a building without a restroom to be acceptable.
<u>Hoist:</u>	
	We would request one new hoist be added, the hoist facility can be seen on the diagrams attached.
	Bettencourt Fisheries is willing to finance and facilitate the building of that hoist if other terms can be agreed upon.
Storage	<u>e:</u>
	We would request equal freezer space in the same location as the other 3 leaseholders.
	We request equal dock storage and parking lot storage as the other 3 leaseholders.
	We request that storage space be striped and clearly marked as to which areas are for which leaseholders.

Lease Rate & Term:

We would expect to negotiate for a fair market value per square foot comparable to existing building's new leases the Harbor is executing, adjusted for amenities and capital investments as the new location is determined.
Bettencourt Fisheries would pay all offloading and purchasing fees as set forth in other newly executed leases, as well as require any non-lessee buyers working with us to purchase a Commercial Activity Permit.
We would request terms and conditions comparable to other leases within the space.
We request a 5 year lease with (2) 5 yr options

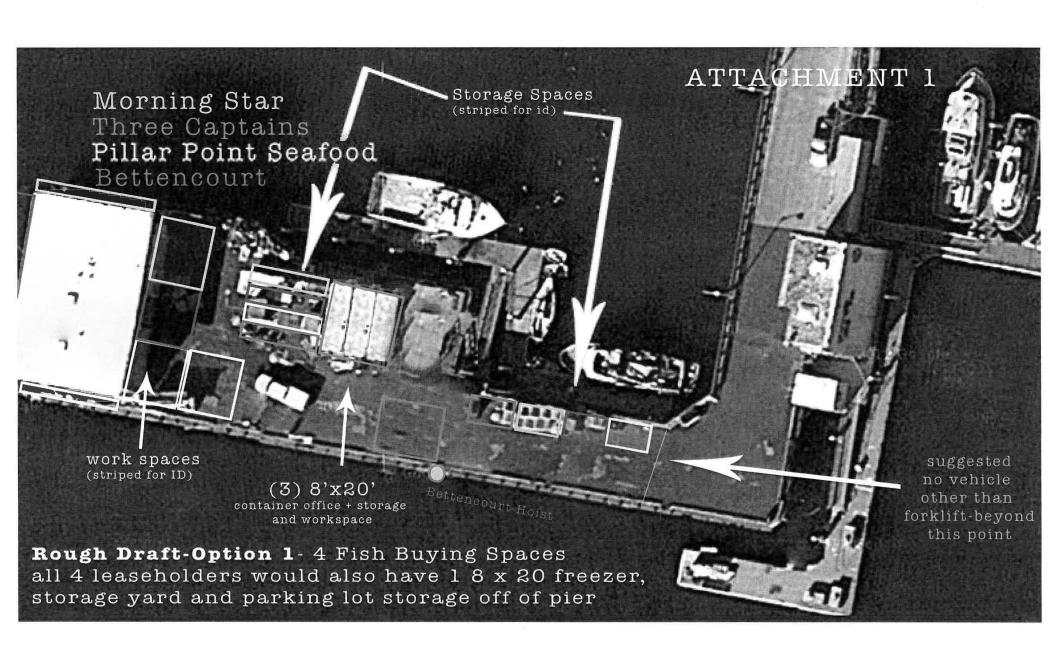
Benefits:

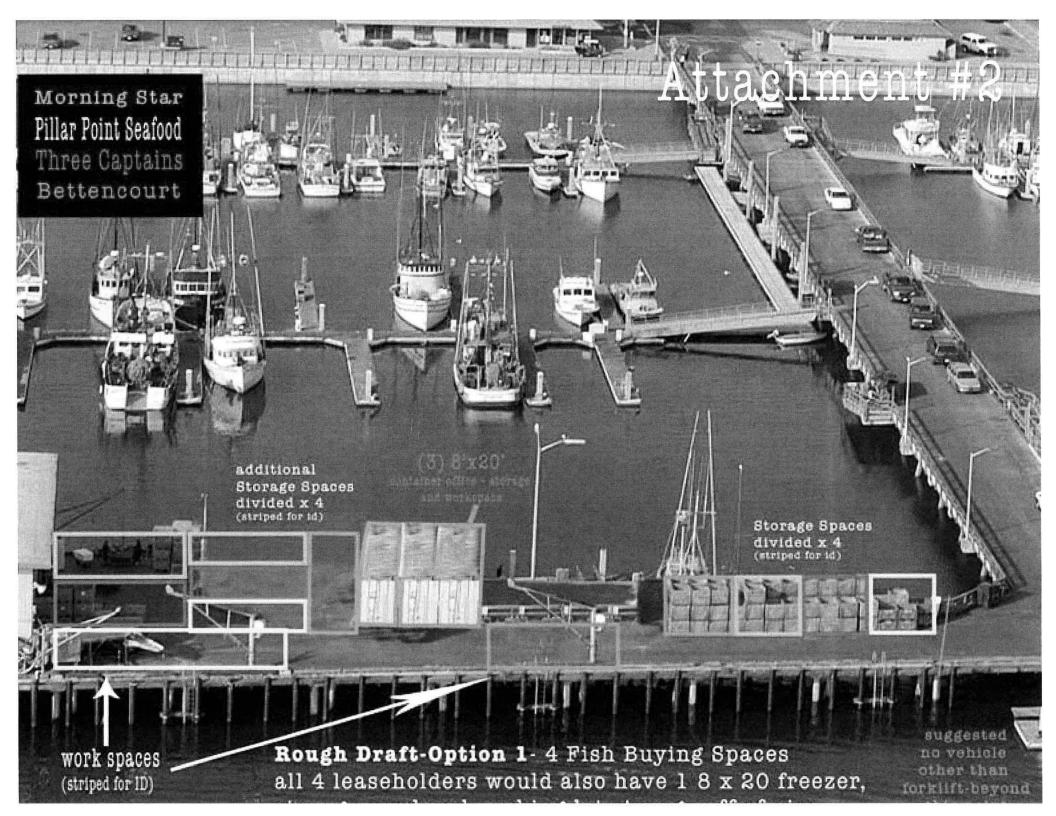

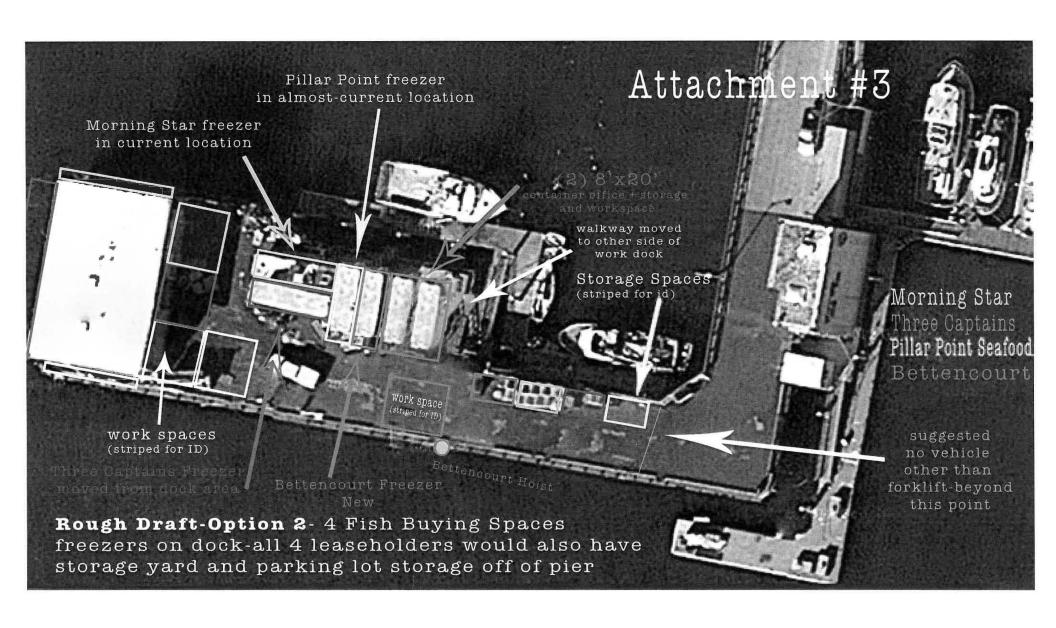
Guaranteed offload of groundfish caught under IFQ

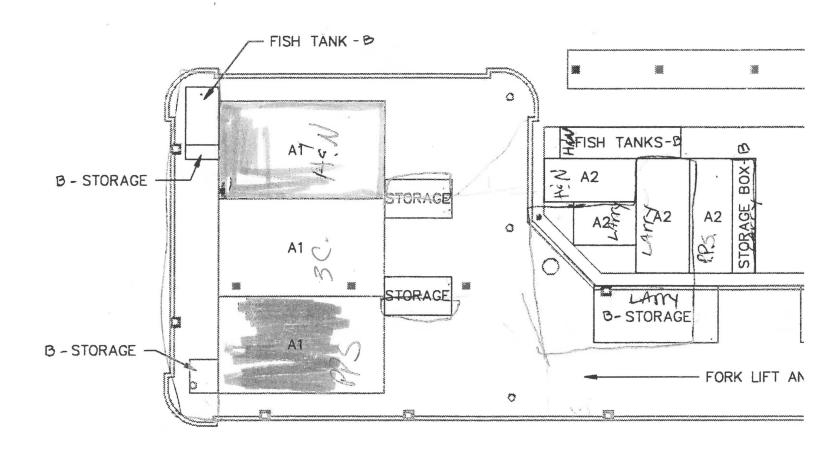






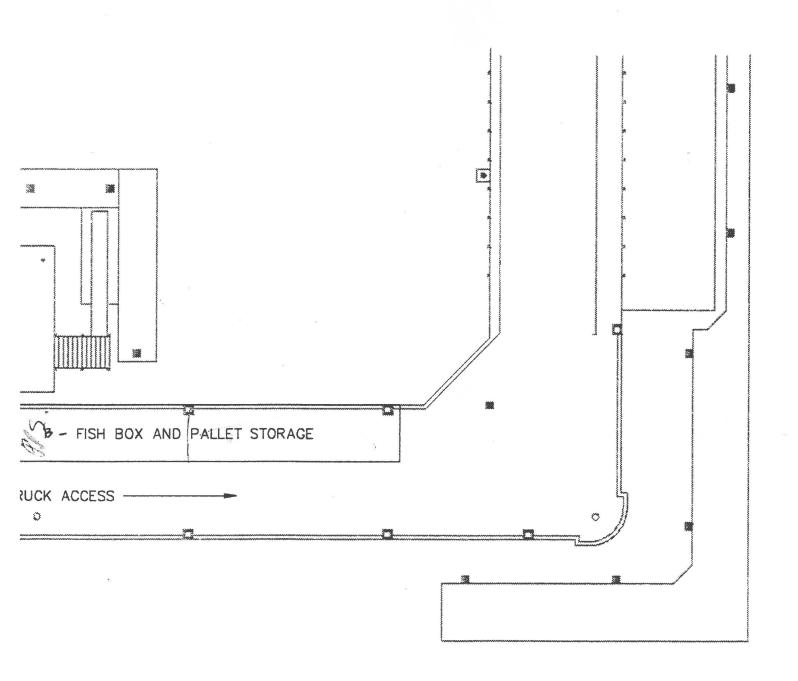


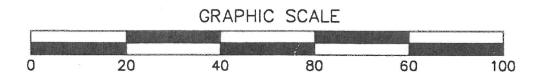
JOHNSON PIER DRAWING



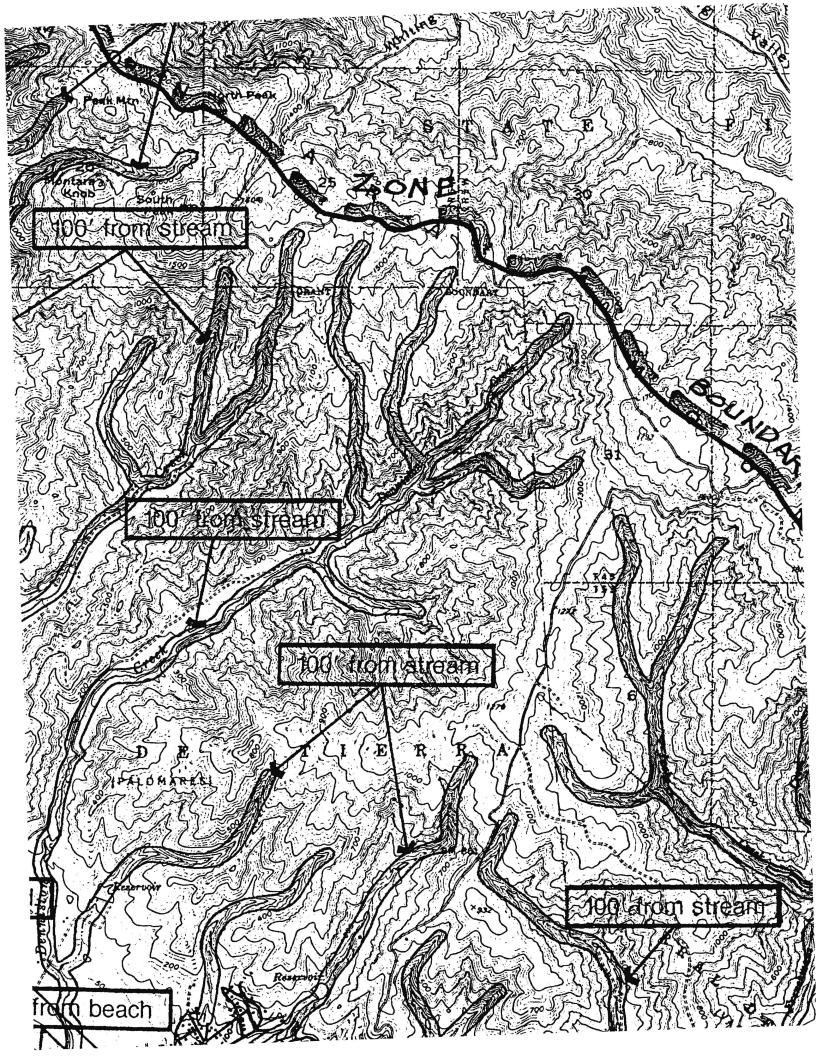

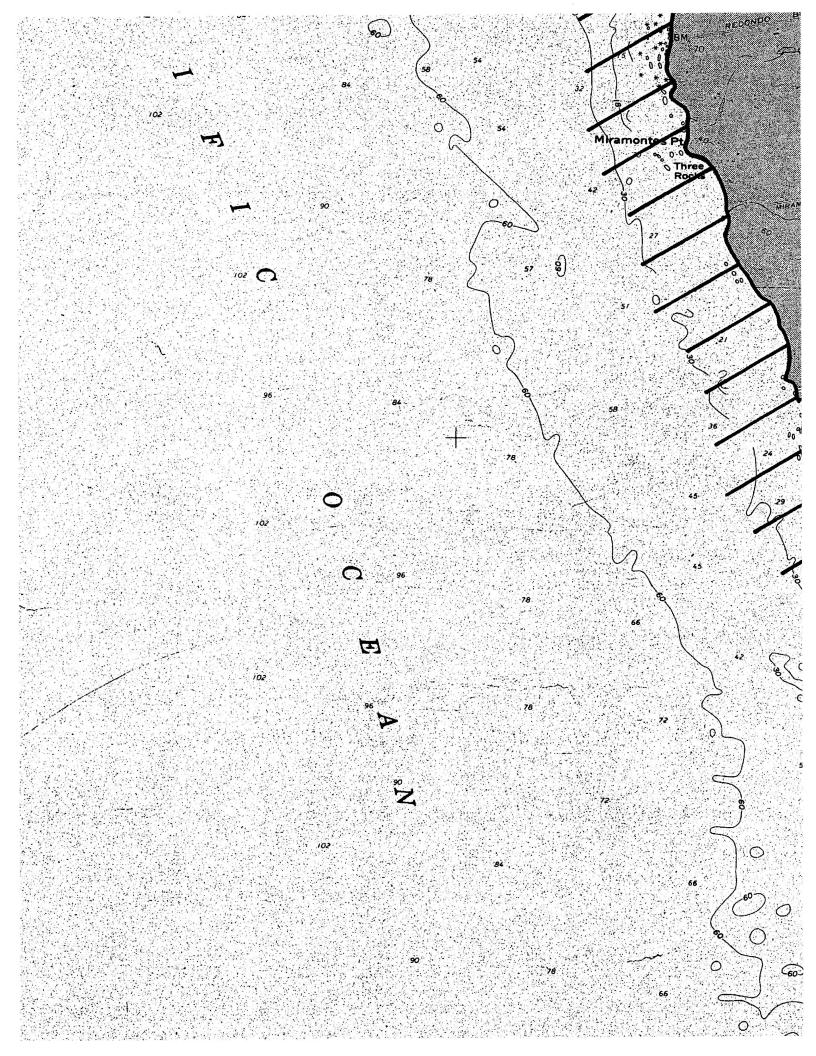

Hi Sabrina,

I am still at the office and saw your email questions as I close out the day.

The hoist or jib crane style should be less than 600 pounds total weight of which includes the support arms, and other metal frame components. This type of unit is older, so sorry but I do not have an actual weight of its total on record that I can find at this moment.

The district hoist (near the harbor office) is annually inspected and should be coming up for inspection in April.

In late December 2013, I contacted each of the fish buyers by phone and with the memo attached regarding our inspection schedule and if they wished to have the same firm perform their hoist inspections at the same time there may be some economies of scale with the volume of hoists to be inspected. The second page of the scan demonstrates our inspector who sends the reports to the state and OSHA. Inspections and certifications of the hoists are the buyers responsibility.

Construction/maintenance efforts are typically not a cause for inspection unless load changes of the hoist has been made or major if major modifications have been performed or a location change occurred. It's a very common activity to install new bearings and or new cables as a maintenance activity due to use, and that effort would not require an inspection unless load changes (typically increased load) occurred.

When inspections and certifications occur, the inspector typically uses a dummy weight that is a percentage of the maximum load and performs a load test, the inspector then also checks operability, and various safety aspects of the unit much of what is done at the same time. In many cases inspectors may make repair recommendations, or service changes, and even may note that no inspection is required due to type or load capacities.

First my apologies for not getting this information out to you last week while I was on leave when I was informed of this incident on Friday.

I will try to keep this update brief..

Last year the bull rail (a bull rail is the wooden railroad like timber on the dock edge) was replaced on Johnson pier. When the Morning Star hoist which rests on the bull rail was reinstalled after the deck surface work was done, it apparently was not set or reinstalled correctly enough for proper swing. (Note this hoists are 20+ years old, a potential combination of new deck surface, old hoist, new bull rail of recycled material may be part of the cause) Dave Mallory informed us late fall of the issue, Valentine Construction was out to review and Princeton Welding was brought in to make the adjustment corrections after the rush of fish unloading was done.

On this past Friday, Morning Star staff were demonstrating the hoist swing issues to Princeton Welding, during the demonstration the hoist came loose and fell off the pier into the harbor waters.

No injuries, or boats were in the pathway of the falling hoist and there was no load on the hoist at the time of demonstration.

District staff have been working with those involved to bring the hoist back up the pier from inner harbor waters, and Princeton Welding will be picking it up for minor repairs this week. Dave Mallory is working with other fish buyers to unload any fish during the down time. Fish unloading presently is quite slow as crab is about done for the season. Everyone is working together on this till resolved.

The second hoist was re-installed with the tenant supplied base bearing by Mark Harris. That tenant and Mark discussed relatively new condition of the top bearing so the tenant decided against replacing it at that time. After installation, we were on the site for a number of months with no complaints about its operation. I did specifically caution in the email below on June 17 that the hoist was compromised by the severe visible corrosion.

We can't speak to the problem you had with the hoist separating from the deck but I had cautioned against trying to re-hab these units in our early meetings a year ago. In addition to the visible corrosion, the design of this piece of lifting equipment has a number of weaknesses. There is only about a 2" socket depth at the base which is only secured by gravity and the weight of the load. At the top, the bearing plate is by design pulled down by the back 45degree stay which puts an obvious side load on the bearing that it cannot resist. See the attached photo of the top plate at hoist #2 before it was re-painted. Any load on the hook only pulls the plate down more which allows the entire hoist to rock during its swing. Another issue is the lack of a retainer cap at the top bearing axel pin of hoist #2 versus Hoist #1. It appears that there is nothing to keep the top bearing from pulling off the top hoist axel pin in an extreme event. (See photo Hoist-01)

If I understand correctly the hoist was being investigated and separated off its mounts when pushed/swung out without a load. From what I can see of the reliance on gravity to keep it together, this would seem to be the weakest point in the operation the hoist.

I am not a design engineer but would again caution against putting these hoists back in service without a thorough engineering review.

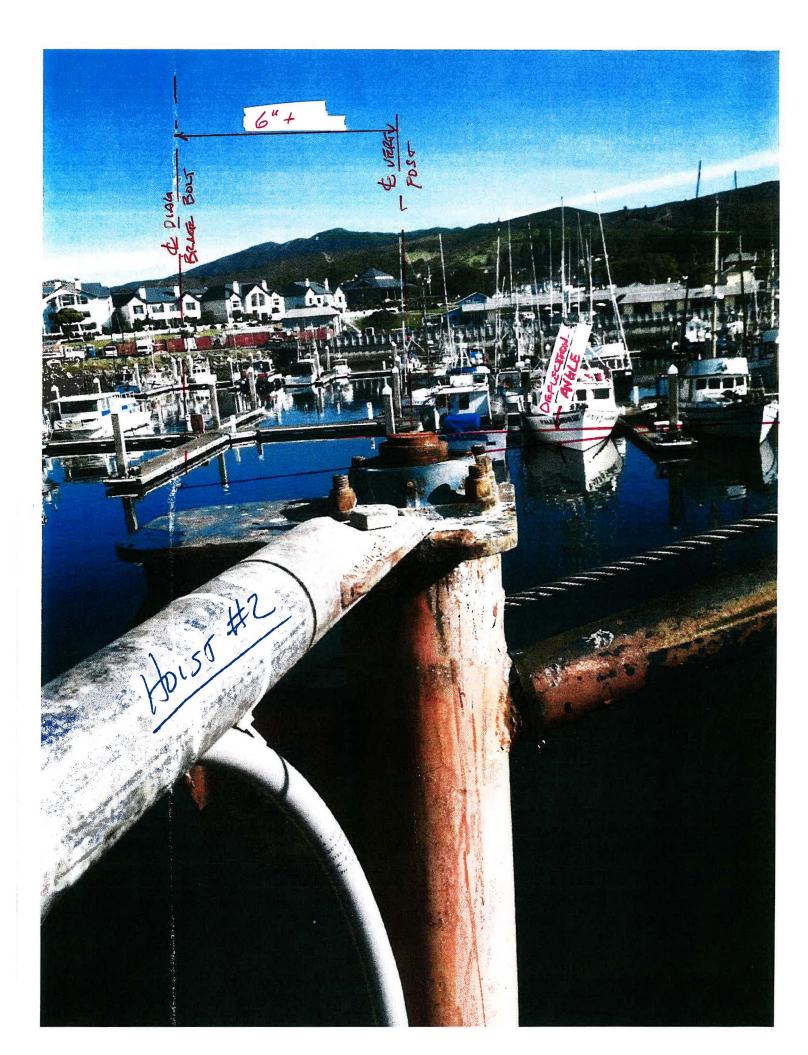

First of all Scot, the hoist is on my flat-bed truck to be delivered to Bob in the morning. Peter, Scot suggested I fire off this e-mail to you should the subject of my hoist situation come up tomorrow night. I wish I could make it, but, will be out of town from about 10 a.m. tomorrow til Monday. Starting sometime tomorrow, Bob, at Princeton Welding will, hopefully, get started on the repair and reinstallation of my hoist, which fell in the water a week ago from last Saturday.

Peter, I assume Scot has already, or will ,clue you in on the specifics, but, the general digression of my hoist goes like this: the original problem of increased difficulty of rotation due to "give" in the wood railings was corrected,I assume, when Valentine Corp. replaced the wood railings with the composite. But, when the hoist was taken out to replace the railings it wasn't put back in correctly. That was in the Sept.-Oct. period. There wasn't much use of the hoist immediately after as most of the fishermen were preparing for crab. Roger was doing some "drag" fishing, but not much else going on. Things seemed fine, although we noticed the metal plate on top was not quite level. And there is a bearing which sets on top of the plate.

Crab season starts. Action picks up. And the hoist becomes harder and harder to turn. St. Clair, my hoistman was constantly complaining. He and "Roo" would mention occasionally of seeing the metal plate "shift". St. Clair is currently seeing a chiropractor, because of problems he attributes to the increased effort in turning the hoist. I bring this up a few times to Scot. Bob, of Princeton Welding, comes and takes a look sometime around middle of December. And shortly there-after a couple guys from the "Valentine" crew came over. I saw them doing something over on McHenry's hoist. Asked them if they'd seen mine yet. Said, "Yes, we've seen it, and know what needs to be done". Nothing was done. At this point Bob was hesitant to get in the middle. My frustration continues. Bob comes for another look. We agree it can wait til after the holidays, or until it slows down a bit. I also thought Scot was in communication with Bob. Guess not. But, between me and Scot, we get Bob back over. He comes on the morning of Febuary 21st. He's somewhat perplexed. But he's checking it out. When we swing the hoist out to 90 degrees that metal plate rocks back and rises a bit. When we swing it on around a full 180 it shifts and rises some more. Same thing on the way back. Bob thought it would be good to talk to "Valentine" to find out what they did, but couldn't find anyone to talk to. Felt he was getting in the middle of something. Bob decided to come out the next day to take some pictures. We had already unloaded the "Tabitha" that morning, Saturday, the 22nd, before Bob came out again. Now, in unloading most boats we don' need to swing the hoist out much more than about 45 degrees. But Bob wanted to test it the full 180. In that testing, somewhere between 90 and 180 degrees that metal plate rose so high it came out of the vertical cylinder it was supporting and fell and the entire hoist fell in the water. Now that metal plate shifting was something new, because we had shifted the hoist around a full 180 numerous times before so we could unload squid.

So, I've said all that, to say this. That hoist was not put back in the same condition it was taken out. It was structurally altered. Although it is slow now, salmon season is less than two months away. And there are some crab boats, and drag boats and some black cod to unload in the meantime. This is not the time to get muddled in politics and bureaucracy. So Bob will get to work, and I will pay him. But. I do

not accept full responsibility for the problem that has occurred and expect "the Harbor" to show fairness and responsibility in helping me shoulder some of this financial outlay.

Hi Sabrina,

I am still at the office and saw your email questions as I close out the day.

The hoist or jib crane style should be less than 600 pounds total weight of which includes the support arms, and other metal frame components. This type of unit is older, so sorry but I do not have an actual weight of its total on record that I can find at this moment.

The district hoist (near the harbor office) is annually inspected and should be coming up for inspection in April.

In late December 2013, I contacted each of the fish buyers by phone and with the memo attached regarding our inspection schedule and if they wished to have the same firm perform their hoist inspections at the same time there may be some economies of scale with the volume of hoists to be inspected. The second page of the scan demonstrates our inspector who sends the reports to the state and OSHA. Inspections and certifications of the hoists are the buyers responsibility.

Construction/maintenance efforts are typically not a cause for inspection unless load changes of the hoist has been made or major if major modifications have been performed or a location change occurred. It's a very common activity to install new bearings and or new cables as a maintenance activity due to use, and that effort would not require an inspection unless load changes (typically increased load) occurred.

When inspections and certifications occur, the inspector typically uses a dummy weight that is a percentage of the maximum load and performs a load test, the inspector then also checks operability, and various safety aspects of the unit much of what is done at the same time. In many cases inspectors may make repair recommendations, or service changes, and even may note that no inspection is required due to type or load capacities.

Commissioners,

First my apologies for not getting this information out to you last week while I was on leave when I was informed of this incident on Friday.

I will try to keep this update brief..

Last year the bull rail (a bull rail is the wooden railroad like timber on the dock edge) was replaced on Johnson pier. When the Morning Star hoist which rests on the bull rail was reinstalled after the deck surface work was done, it apparently was not set or reinstalled correctly enough for proper swing. (Note this hoists are 20+ years old, a potential combination of new deck surface, old hoist, new bull rail of recycled material may be part of the cause) Dave Mallory informed us late fall of the issue, Valentine Construction was out to review and Princeton Welding was brought in to make the adjustment corrections after the rush of fish unloading was done.

On this past Friday, Morning Star staff were demonstrating the hoist swing issues to Princeton Welding, during the demonstration the hoist came loose and fell off the pier into the harbor waters.

No injuries, or boats were in the pathway of the falling hoist and there was no load on the hoist at the time of demonstration.

District staff have been working with those involved to bring the hoist back up the pier from inner harbor waters, and Princeton Welding will be picking it up for minor repairs this week. Dave Mallory is working with other fish buyers to unload any fish during the down time. Fish unloading presently is quite slow as crab is about done for the season. Everyone is working together on this till resolved.

Incident Report for JOHNSON PIER FISH BUYER HOIST FAILURE

Overview of Incident

On February 21, 2014 the Morning Star Fisheries hoist while being operated by a Morning Star Fisheries employee disconnected from its head piece supports and fell into the water. No injuries occurred to vessel or person.

The attached report will provide a timeline of the recent history of the hoist and a certified review of the hoist design, maintenance, service logs and the ability to be Cal/OSHA certified.

Findings Overview

- [May June 2013] Hoist was removed by a licensed and bonded contractor (Valentine) during the period that the pier deck surface work was
 occurring. During such time, the hoist was painted by the contractor prior return of the hoist after the pier deck surface work was complete.
- [June 17-18, 2013] Hoist was returned, reassembled at the present pier location. Morning Star Fisheries "Roo" ordered and provided new bearings to Valentine to install as the hoist was being reassembled. Upon the hoist being reinstalled, Valentine met with the Morning Star Fisheries and confirmed the hoist was installed and met their installation expectations.
- IDec. 16, 2013 Morning Star Fisheries owner notified Scott G. that the hoist working correctly. (after over 5 months of heavy use).
- [Dec. 16, 2013] District staff acted immediately calling both Valentine and Princeton Welding. Minor work determined to be performed was
 delayed by Morning Star Fisheries owner due to busy crab buying season till after the season slowed.
- 5. [Feb 21, 2014] Hoist fell off the pier and into the water.
- 6. [Feb 25, 2014] No Tenant/User maintenance logs for service, nor certification records of the hoist are available.
- 7. [Feb 28, 2014] Per AC3 inspector, be would not certify this type of hoist. He also noted that hoists should be removed and replaced with new jib hoists. Present hoists are in various stages of unsafe.

Incident Report for JOHNSON PIER FISH BUYER HOIST FAILURE

Overview of Incident

On February 21, 2014 the Morning Star Fisheries hoist while being operated by a Morning Star Fisheries employee disconnected from its head piece supports and fell into the water. No injuries occurred to vessel or person.

The attached report will provide a timeline of the recent history of the hoist and a certified review of the hoist design, maintenance, service logs and the ability to be Cal/OSHA certified.

Findings Overview

- 1. [May June 2013] Hoist was removed by a licensed and bonded contractor (Valentine) during the period that the pier deck surface work was occurring. During such time, the hoist was painted by the contractor prior return of the hoist after the pier deck surface work was complete.
- 2. [June 17-18, 2013] Hoist was returned, reassembled at the present pier location. Morning Star Fisheries "Roo" ordered and provided new bearings to Valentine to install as the hoist was being reassembled. Upon the hoist being reinstalled, Valentine met with the Morning Star Fisheries and confirmed the hoist was installed and met their installation expectations.
- 3. [Dec. 16, 2013] Morning Star Fisheries owner notified Scott G. that the hoist working correctly, [after over 5 months of beavy use].
- 4. [Dec. 16, 2013] District staff acted immediately calling both Valentine and Princeton Welding. Minor work determined to be performed was delayed by Morning Star Fisheries owner due to busy crab buying season till after the season slowed.
- 5. [Feb 21, 2014] Hoist fell off the pier and into the water
- 6. [Feb 25, 2014] No Tenant/User maintenance logs for service, nor certification records of the hoist are available.
- 7. [Feb 28, 2014] Per AC3 inspector, he would not certify this type of hoist. He also noted that hoists should be removed and replaced with new jib hoists. Present hoists are in various stages of unsafe.

While swinging past the arc of approx. 180 degrees over the water, the top pipe of the horizontal boom contacted the diagonal pipe stay.

The motion of the boom swinging horizontally caused the diagonal, which is bolted at the bottom, to raise up and free the top of the mast bearing which allowed the entire hoist to fall into the water.

A couple of observations and thoughts and paraphrasing of conversations with involved people

When Valentine was here last year they took the hoist down and to their yard. As seen in the attached photos it appears that all they did was cleanup and paint. No attempt at rebuild was done. I think this was done in April 2013.

We were made aware of the hoist not working correctly by Dave around the middle of Dec. and contacted Princeton Welding to make corrections. Dave said it was too busy at that time and I understood that HE would contact BOB at PW when things slowed down. Dave complained last week about us dragging our feet about fixing HIS hoist.

During the time since we were told that something was wrong I have had a few conversations with Dave's employee's. The most recent was with Mike St. Clair. He was complaining about his shoulder being damaged by the difficulty of swinging the hoist and repeated and ongoing trips to the doctor.

An earlier talk with ROO (1 mo. Ago) related how he was the one who ordered the new bearings that were installed at the time of Valentines "rebuild". He had to order twice because the first set did not fit. I don't think he is a machinist but looking at the worn bearing raceways, more than a new set is needed to fix this Hoist.

The wrong size bearings and worn raceways would account for the offset at the base of the mast and the wobble of the top plate causing the plate to contact the top of the mast making it difficult to swing. The design of the hoist does not account for upward vertical movement.

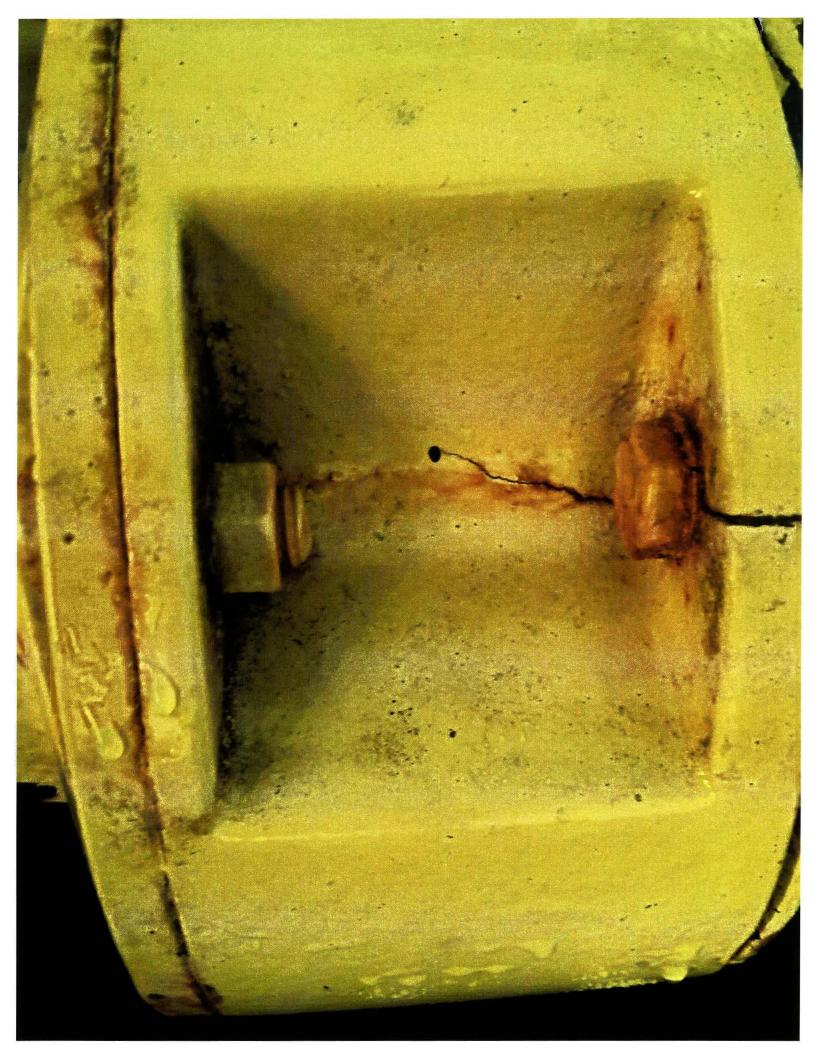

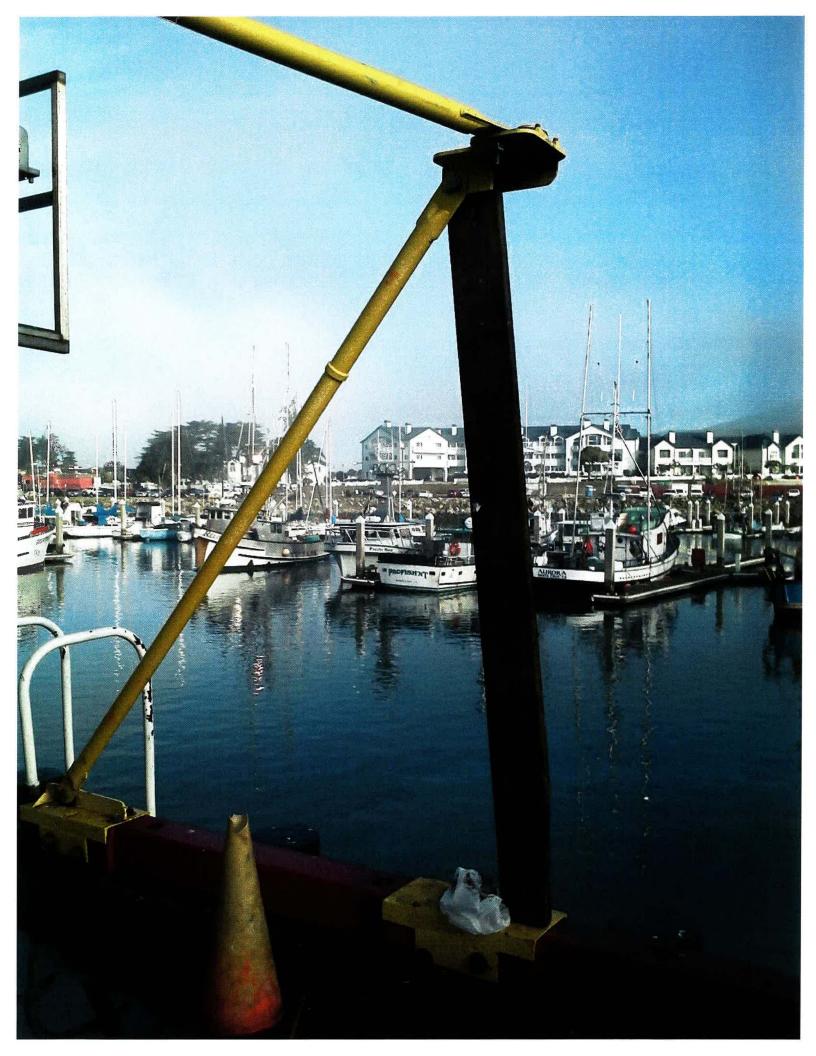

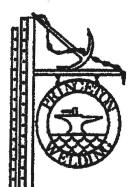

BACKGROUND

USA Productions has held several events through the San Mateo County Harbor District.

Silicon Valley Triathlons was held in Half Moon Bay on April 20, 2014 and Morgan Hill Triathlons was held in Oyster Point Marina/Park on Sunday, May 18. 2014. Both of these events were extremely successful.

USA Productions is not a non-profit, but they are asking for a fee waiver because they will be making donations to the Half Moon Bay Rotary Club and Boys & Girls Club of America in the Half Moon Bay Area. USA Productions will be donating \$2,500 to the Boys and Girls Club and will donate 10% of revenue plus \$20 per volunteer to the Half Moon Bay Rotary Club.

This triathlon event involves a swim, bike, and run course. Participants will swim and will start and end on the beach directly below Sam's

Participant Parking and Expo Parking -will have signage for trail use and race awareness. Participants will pay for their own parking fees during the event. USA Productions will provide parking passes for volunteers, staff, and vendors/sponsors.

Notifications: Local residents and businesses will be aware of the event well in advance. We will use several methods of notifications to give people plenty of time to plan for the event to minimize minimal impact. These methods will be through email, signage, city communication channels, flyers dropped at homes, and other county sources.

Silicon Valley Triathlons Bike Course Safety Plan

The bike course for this event is a 9 mile and 24.9 mile out and back course that starts and finishes in the same location in Pillar Point Harbor. The bikers will transition from water to bike and from bike to run in the same location.

All athletes can read the course rules on the USA Productions web site and will have copies of the rules in their registration packets. There will also be a reminder prior to the start of the race of these rules. The following is a list of the precautions USA Productions has taken to ensure a safe race:

1. The bike course is coned heavily in the city jurisdiction and in a line of site fashion in the county. This is to let bikers know they are still on course. Each turn on the course is heavily coned with chalk markings, signage and volunteers.

- 2. The County Police and CHP will be on scene and will provide officers at key locations along the course. We will also have a CHP Sergeant who monitors the officers and stages with the bike course director during the entire bike portion of the event.
- 3. The private motor escorts in uniform will lead and sag the athletes, as well as cruise the course during the race to trouble shoot any problems that may come up and to look for stranded or injured bikers. A motor escort will follow the last biker out of the transition area and makes sure the very last biker gets back to the venue.
- 4. There is an ambulance on site and parked in the venue and communicates with the Bike Course director throughout the race. The ambulance will be used for transportation as well as general first aid for anyone on the course. As an added insurance for the proper emergency medical response for on course injuries the county Police or CHP will call for Fire and Ambulance needs through their communications and will cancel those responding units if the event ambulance arrives first and can handle the incident. This helps to reduce any time delay for emergencies on the course.
- 5. Volunteers are placed at all turns to keep the bikers on course. They are also used to remind the bikers to slow down on certain portions of the course to help avoid crashes.
- 6. Once the last biker leaves the transition area a "Cone Truck" is sent along the course behind that biker and picks up the cones. The truck is also used as a sweeper to collect any biker that may have broken down and cannot continue with the race.
- 7. As stated in the "rules of the race" all roadways are open to the public and will be shared with vehicle traffic. All bikers are expected to obey all rules of the road. This includes the direction given them by any City Police or CHP officer on the course.

As the event promoter we will be working closely with the CHP, County Police and Motor Escort officers.

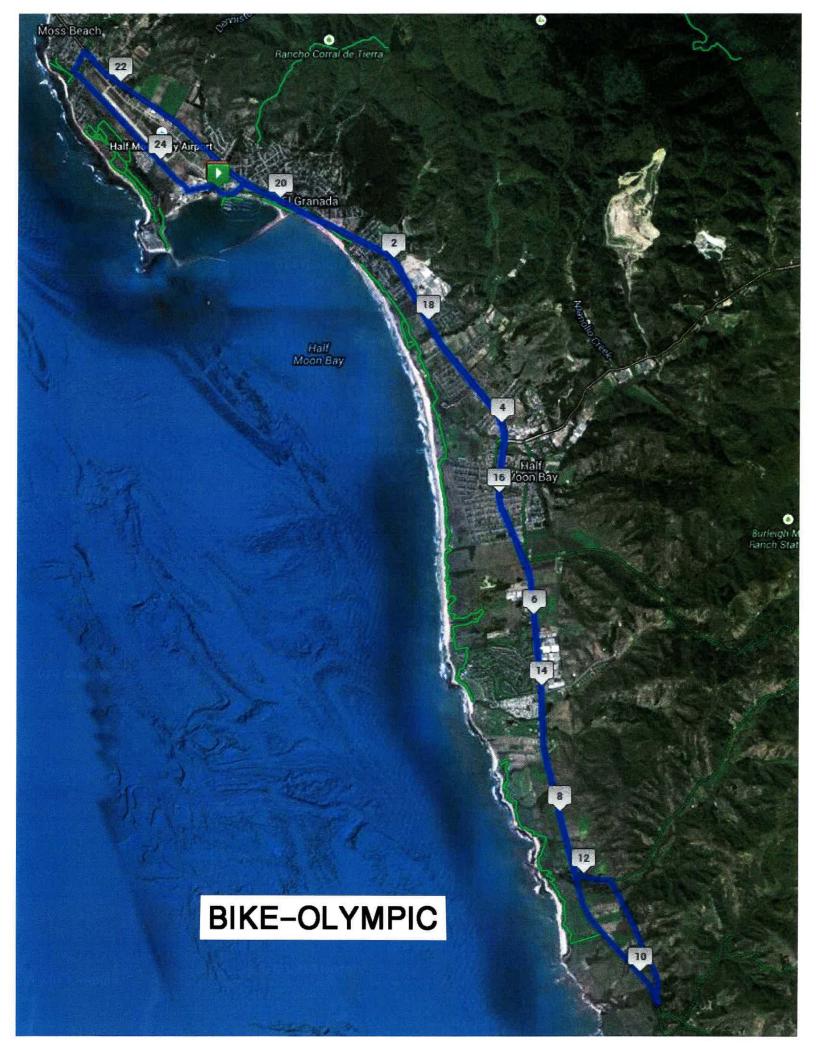














Staff Report

HARBOR COMMISSIONER BENEFITS PARITY

Recommendation—To Be Determined

Option 1. Make no changes to District policy. Under current Policy, Commissioners elected prior to 2014 may receive health insurance benefits or a cash pay-out in lieu of such benefits so long as they are in office, and may continue to do so if they are reelected.

Option 2. Change District Policy such that upon commencement of any term of office, no Commissioner will receive health insurance benefits or a cash pay-out in lieu of such benefits. The existing Policy will continue in place with regard to Commissioners presently in office, and any changes to the Policy will apply upon commencement of a re-elected Commissioner's new term of office.

Background

The Board of Harbor Commissioners has asked to revisit the issue of health insurance benefits provided to Commissioners. This issue has come up from time to time.

- On January 27, 2014, the Board of Harbor Commissioner received an informational report (copy attached) that outlined benefits available to Harbor Commissioners at that time.
- On June 18, 2014, after receiving additional reports, (copy attached) the Board of Harbor Commissioners approved changes to the benefits offered to Harbor Commissioners. The Board chose to discontinue benefits for newly elected Commissioners but maintain the current benefits for sitting Commissioners for as long as they remain in office with no breaks in service, even if reelected.

Analysis

Under the California Constitution, the salary of an elected official cannot be reduced during his or her term of office. Both the California Courts of Appeal and the California Attorney General have interpreted the term "salary" in this section of the Constitution to include as elements of compensation, life and health insurance benefits, In sum, any change that the Commissioners vote to make to their compensation/benefits structure may not apply during the current terms of office of current Commissioners.

The District's Policy presently applies differently to Commissioners Parravano, Brennan, and Bernardo than it does to Commissioners David and Mattusch. Commissioners Bernardo, Brennan, Parravano are eligible to receive benefits under the Districts current Policy. Commissioner Bernardo does not avail himself of the benefits entitled him under the Policy. Commissioners David and Mattusch are not eligible to receive benefits under the current Policy

Fiscal Impact

A change in policy that reduces Commissioner benefits could reduce costs. The annualized cost of benefits projected for 2015 are as follows.

Parravano \$24,300 in the form of the health insurance benefit.

\$4,800. Commissioner Brennan began receiving a cash pay-out in lieu Brennan

Currently, San Mateo County Harbor District Commissioners are eligible for health benefit coverage through Operating Engineers Public Employees Health & Welfare Trust Fund, Local Union No. 3, and Teamsters Local Union 856.

The District does not and has never provided lifetime health benefits.

Commissioners are eligible for the following benefits:

District Policy 6.4.1 - Offers Harbor Commissioners and all eligible dependents group health and medical insurance.

District Policy 6.4.2 – Offers Harbor Commissioners and their dependents group dental coverage.

District Policy 6.4.3 – Offers Harbor Commissioners and their dependents group optical benefits.

District Policy 6.4.4 – Pays for life insurance and AD&D coverage for Harbor Commissioners

District Policy 6.4.5 – Group Health and medical insurance pay out program for Harbor Commissioners

For Harbor Commissioners who would like to opt out of the coverage offered by the Harbor District, District Policy 6.4.5 allows Harbor Commissioners to either receive a payout of fifty percent of the cost of coverage or \$400.00, whichever is less, or upon receipt of evidence of the Commissioner's payment of his or her own health and medical insurance premiums, deductibles, and/or co-payments, the District shall reimburse the Commissioner the amount the Commissioner paid for said insurance premiums, deductibles and/or co-payments up to the same level of coverage under the District's health and medical insurance program

District Policy 6.4.6 – Retirement System - San Mateo County Harbor Commissioners appointed or elected prior to 1/1/1994 or later are not eligible to participate under CalPERS.

District Policy 6.4.7 – Board of Harbor Commissioners appointed or elected after January 1, 1995 are not eligible to participate in the Longevity Health Insurance Program.

To be eligible for the longevity benefit, Commissioners appointed or elected prior to January 1, 1995, provided that the individual met all of the following conditions:

- A. The individuals total service at the time of termination or leaving office, for any reason, is not less than twelve (12) years, even if service occurred prior to January 1, 1981;
- B. The individual was an employee or served in office after January 1, 1981;
- C. In the case of an employee, the individual's employment was not terminated for good cause; and
- D. In the case of a Commissioner, he/she shall be deemed to have fulfilled the requisite twelve (12) years of service if he/she was appointed or elected to serve three (3) terms in office and actually served at least eleven (11) years and six (6) months in office.

Attached are copies of all policies pertaining to these benefits.

Current Harbor District Commissioners who receive any of the above-listed benefits are as follows:

- Commissioner Holsinger Receives group health, dental, optical benefits.
- Commissioner Parravano Receives group health, dental and optical benefits.
- Commissioner Tucker Receives the payout option of \$400.00 per month.

Both Commissioner Bernardo and Commissioner Brennan have not chosen any of the options available to them.

Former Harbor District Commissioners who receive or have received benefits:

- Former Commissioner Campbell through the Longevity Health Insurance Program her dependent is eligible for paid health, dental and vision and life insurance benefits for 9.5 years (114 months) or when he ceases to be eligible upon his turning 26 years old.
- Former Commissioner Lee through the Longevity Health Insurance Program his dependent was eligible for paid health, dental and vision and life insurance benefits was eligible and received benefits through June 2011.

1. STATEMENT OF POLICY

The San Mateo County Harbor District offers to all regular full-time employees and Harbor Commissioners and all eligible dependents group health and medical insurance. Coverage for regular full-time employees becomes effective the first day of the month following the date of employment and coverage for Harbor Commissioners becomes effective the first day of the month following the official swearing in ceremony. Medical coverage may be continued during an approved leave of absence at the employee's own expense.

The District reserves the right to seek out and obtain comparable coverage on an annual basis in order to effect cost savings to the District.

2. DESCRIPTION OF PROCEDURES

During the in-processing of regular, full-time employees and Harbor Commissioners, the Human Resource Manager shall provide the eligible employee and/or Commissioner with enrollment forms for the District's health and medical insurance carrier.

Enrollment forms should be completed in the following instances:

- New regular, full-time employees or Harbor Commissioners beginning service with the District.
- 2) Adding an eligible dependent.
- Deleting a dependent.
- 4) Change in marital status.
- 5) Dependent reaching maximum age for coverage.

Enrollment cards are available from the Administration office. It is the employee's responsibility to notify the Administration of any change in dependent status by completing updated enrollment cards.

A regular, full-time employee on an approved leave of absence may continue health and medical insurance coverage under the same basis by paying the full cost to the District in advance for each month or portion thereof of which he or she is absent, subject to limitations set by the insurance carrier.

Employees on Family Federal Leave Absence (FMLA) shall be entitled to maintain group health and medical coverage on the same basis as if he/she had continued to work at the District. The District shall continue paying the employee's benefits during the FMLA leave.

Upon termination of employment with the District, the employee may elect to continue health and medical insurance coverage under the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act (R.L. 99-272) (COBRA). The Administration or their designee provides eligible employees with information on COBRA.

The District recognizes and appreciates its employees and to that end, pays premiums for life insurance and accidental death and dismemberment (AD&D) for those employees who are classified as full-time and for Harbor Commissioners. Paying for life insurance coverage and AD&D coverage to District employees and Commissioners, the District recognizes the importance of financial security to employee's family and loved ones in case of accidental death or dismemberment.

The District reserves the right to seek out and obtain comparable coverage on an annual basis in order to effect cost savings to the District.

2. LIFE INSURANCE

Coverage for life insurance is effective the first day of the month following the first day of employment. Changes in coverage amounts will become effective the first day of the month following the date of change. Coverage will terminate upon the employee or Commissioner leaving District employment, the employee moves to a part-time status, or the policy is discontinued completely by the District.

Specific benefits and terms of the policy are provided each new employee by the Human Resource Manager. It is the employee's individual responsibility to keep information on file related to this policy upto-date as to name, address, and beneficiary(s).

3. ACCIDENTAL DEATH AND DISMEMBERMENT

Accidental death and dismemberment (AD&D) is also proved to full-time employees and Harbor Commissioners.

Coverage for accidental death and dismemberment is effective the first day of the month following the first day of employment. Changes in coverage amounts will become effective the first day of the month following the date of change. Coverage will terminate upon the employee or Commissioner leaving District employment, the employee moves to a part-time status, or the policy is discontinued completely by the District.

Specific benefits and terms of the policy are provided each new employee by Human Resource Manager. It is the employee's individual responsibility to keep information on file related to this policy up-to-date as to name, address, and beneficiary(s).

1.0 **Statement of Policy**

The San Mateo County Harbor District offers to all regular full-time employees and Harbor Commissioners and all eligible dependents group health and medical insurance, inclusive of medical, dental and vision. For those employees and Commissioners who provide evidence of alternative health and medical insurance, the District offers a Health and Medical Insurance Pay Out Program.

The District's Pay Out Program is available for health and medical insurance, dental insurance, and vision insurance. If the District is contracting with a carrier for a package of insurance, the payout is based on the package and the employee or Commissioner must show alternative evidence of coverage for all insurances in the package. If the District is contracting with individual carriers the payout may be on one or all of the eligible insurance (e.g. health and medical, dental and vision.)

The District reserves the right to seek out and obtain comparable coverage on an annual basis in order to affect cost savings to the District.

Pay Out 2.0

Employees

Any regular, full-time employee who provides evidence of alternative health and medical insurance may opt to withdraw from the District's health and medical insurance program. If the District will affect savings as a result of not having to pay premiums for these employees who withdraw from the program, fifty percent (50%) of such savings shall be returned to the individual in the form of a bonus payable concurrent with regular payroll. For employees who are eligible for single plan coverage but opt out, they shall receive fifty percent (50%) of District sayings from the premiums for the single rate. Likewise for employees eligible for the family plan but opt out, they shall receive fifty percent (50%) of District savings from the premiums for the family rate. Employees hired after July 1, 2009, shall receive 50% of the aforementioned applicable rate or \$400.00 whichever is less.

B. Commissioners

Any Harbor Commissioner who provides evidence of alternative health and medical insurance may opt to withdraw from the District's health and medical insurance program. Upon receipt of evidence of the Commissioner's payment of his or her own health and medical insurance premiums, deductibles, and/or co-payments, the District shall reimburse the Commissioner the amount the Commissioner paid for said insurance premiums, deductibles and/or co-payments for him/herself and his/her dependents up to the amount the District currently pays for the same level of coverage (e.g. single or family) under the District's health and medical insurance program; or as an alternative if the Commissioners prefers and is eligible for family plan coverage, the Commissioner shall received fifty percent of \$400.00, whichever is less. Under no circumstances shall the total reimbursement exceed the District payment for the same level of coverage under the District health and medical insurance program.

1. STATEMENT OF POLICY

All regular full-time San Mateo County Harbor District employees shall participate under the California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS). Commissioners appointed or elected prior to 1/1/1994 shall participate under CalPERS. Commissioners appointed or elected on 1/1/1994 or later are not eligible to participate under CalPERS (See Policy 6.4.8 Social Security).

Part-time employees working over 1000 hours in a year are required to participate in the CalPERS retirement system based on CalPERS retirement law.

Retirement benefits accrue from both employee and employer contributions. Contributions to the retirement system are mandatory for eligible positions and are deducted from the member's salary each payroll period.

The Retirement System provides for retirement benefits and disability protection when a member meets the plan requirements. Employer contributions are not refundable under any circumstance. Employees are vested with a minimum of five years of service under the plan.

If a member terminates service without retiring, accumulated contributions, with earned interest, are refundable upon request through CalPERS. Annual benefit statements are provided by the Retirement System to participating members. Employees may request an estimate of benefits from the retirement system at any time to obtain an approximate projected retirement benefit figure.

Enrollment and benefits forms are available through the District and CalPERS. It is the employee's individual responsibility to keep information on file up to date related to their retirement account as to name, address and beneficiary(s).

Employees who plan to retire from the system are encouraged to contact the Retirement System at least 90 days in advance of the anticipated retirement date to secure estimate of benefits information and to finalize the retirement date. This action should also be coordinated with the Administration.

The San Mateo County Harbor District has established the longevity health insurance program to recognize and benefit those long time employees who have worked for the harbor district not less than twelve (12) years. Commissioners appointed or elected after January 1, 1995 are not eligible to participate in the longevity health insurance program (G.C. §53201).

Resolution 28-87 was adopted July 15, 1987 and provided for the following:

Any employee, officer, or official of the San Mateo County Harbor District, including members of the Board of Harbor Commissioners, (all hererinafter referred to as the "individual") and any of their eligible dependents, shall be entitled to continue the individual's and dependent's then existing health, dental and vision benefits, and life insurance, at District expense, upon leaving District employment, or leaving office, provided that the individual meets all of the following conditions:

- A. the individuals total service at the time of termination or leaving office, for any reason, is not less than twelve (12) years, even if said service occurred prior to January 1, 1981;
- B. the individual was an employee or served in office after January 1, 1981;
- C. in the case of an employee, the individual's employment was not terminated for good cause; and
- D. in the case of a Commissioner, he/she shall be deemed to have fulfilled the requisite twelve (12) years of service if he/she was appointed or elected to serve three (3) terms in office and actually served at least eleven (11) years and six (6) months in office.

The District shall pay the premiums or other charges for qualifying individual's continuing coverage for health, dental, vision and life insurance benefits pursuant to the following formula: for each two months of service of an individual, the District will pay one month's premium for said life insurance. The premium paid shall be that to provide, at the minimum, the standard health, dental, and vision and life insurance benefits provided to the individual and/or his/her dependents at the time the individual leaves District employment, or leaves office, plus any additions to coverage or increased policy limits provided to continuing employees, or Board members, subject to the provisions of the insurance itself which may limit the level of continuing benefits or coverage. Thereafter, the individual may continue the health and welfare or insurance benefits by personal payment if authorized by the respective carriers. If a qualified individual dies before the District's obligation to pay premiums expires, the District will continue to pay the applicable premiums for the individual's and/or dependents, if any, until the District's obligation under this resolution expires.

If any individual who is otherwise eligible for these continuing benefits obtains similar (not necessary comparable) benefits through any new employment or service with a public or private entity, other than

benefits provided as a self-employed individual, the premiums paid by District for said benefit shall cease permanently, regardless of the cessation of said secondary employment benefit(s).

Any qualified individual has the right to demand that the District make direct payment of the cost of the then applicable health and welfare or life insurance premiums to any other carrier or provider of the individual's choosing. Such payments shall not exceed that which the District would have paid had the individual remained in the District's available program(s).

BACKGROUND

Currently, San Mateo County Harbor District Commissioners are eligible for benefits as outlined in the January 27, 2014 memo to the Board (copy attached). These benefits include health, dental, vision and life insurance plans. Per the Board's request, this staff report addresses options available to the District if the Board determines that it wishes to make changes to benefits currently offered.

In preparing this memo, staff consulted with Liebert, Cassidy, and Whitmore regarding the recently-enacted Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA), which mandates that certain employers provide healthcare insurance to their employees, in order to determine if the District is obligated to offer health coverage to commissioners. Liebert, Cassidy, and Whitmore determined that the District is not an "Applicable Large Employer" under the ACA, and therefore the District is not required to provide health insurance to its employees.

The applicable body of law regarding publicly elected officials' salary and benefits is found in California state law. The California Constitution explicitly states that the salary of an elected official cannot be reduced during his or her term of office. CAL. CONST., art. III, §4. Both the California Courts of Appeal and the California Attorney General have interpreted the term "salary" in this section of the Constitution to say that all elements of compensation, including life and health benefits, become contractually vested upon a publically elected official taking office. Thorning v. Hollister School Dist., 11 Cal.App.4th 1598, 1606 (6th Dist. 1992); see also 67 Ops.Cal.Atty.Gen 510, 512 (1984). As such, those contractually vested benefits cannot be discontinued during a member's term in office.

Based on the above, the Board of Harbor District Commissioners therefore has the following options regarding benefits offered to Commissioners:

Option #1 - No change:

The Board could continue to offer benefits to current and future Commissioners pursuant to District Policy 6.4.1 ("Group Health and Medical Insurance"), District Policy 6.4.2 ("Group Dental Plan"), and 6.4.3 ("Employee Optical Benefit Program"). The Board could also choose to maintain the same life insurance benefit under District Policy 6.4.4 ("Life Insurance").

Option #2 – Discontinue benefits in future terms of office:

The Board could choose to alter or eliminate one or more of the benefits offered to Commissioners, <u>but</u> any change would not be effective until after the next Board election. In other words, the altered or eliminated benefits would continue to be offered to the Commissioners currently holding office but would terminate at the end of their current terms. Newly elected or reelected Commissioners would only be entitled to the newly authorized benefits at the next election.

Option #3 – Discontinue benefits for newly elected Commissioners:

The Board could also choose to alter or discontinue benefits for newly elected Commissioners but maintain the current benefits for reelected Commissioners for as long as they remain in office with no breaks in service. This differs from Option #2, above, in that reelected Commissioners would still have access to benefits if they are reelected.

If the Board of Harbor Commissioners selects one of the options for changes to benefits listed above, staff will bring Resolutions for adoption along with amendments to applicable policies including:

District Policy 6.4.1 – Group Health and Medical Insurance

District Policy 6.4.2 – Group Dental Plan
District Policy 6.4.3 – Employee Optical Benefit Program
District Policy 6.4.4 – Life Insurance

District Policy 6.4.5- Group Health and Medical Insurance Pay Out Program:

If the Board decides to alter or discontinue currently offered benefits, staff will also bring, for the Board's consideration, changes to the language in current District policies which authorize reimbursement to Commissioners who currently maintain their own health insurance, but are entitled to reimbursement. The reimbursement language is outlined in District Policy 6.4.5.2(B).

BACKGROUND

At the May 7, 2014 Board Meeting staff provided the Board of Harbor Commissioners with information on current Harbor District commissioner benefits in regard to health, dental, vision, and life insurance, with options for changes that could be made. (See attached memo)

Staff was requested to research the following:

- Would Commissioners of the Harbor District be eligible for a self-pay?
- What do other comparable agencies offer their part time commissioners?

The Commissioners of the Harbor District would be eligible for a self-pay benefit. The Commissioners would have the option of signing up for coverage through Teamsters Local 856 or Operating Engineers Local Union 3. The costs for coverage are as follows:

- Teamsters Local Union #856 \$1,638.00 per month (cost is the same for single and family coverage)
- Operating Engineers Local Union #3- \$639 \$1,538 per month (cost would depend on single or family coverage)

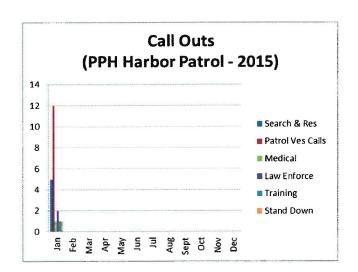


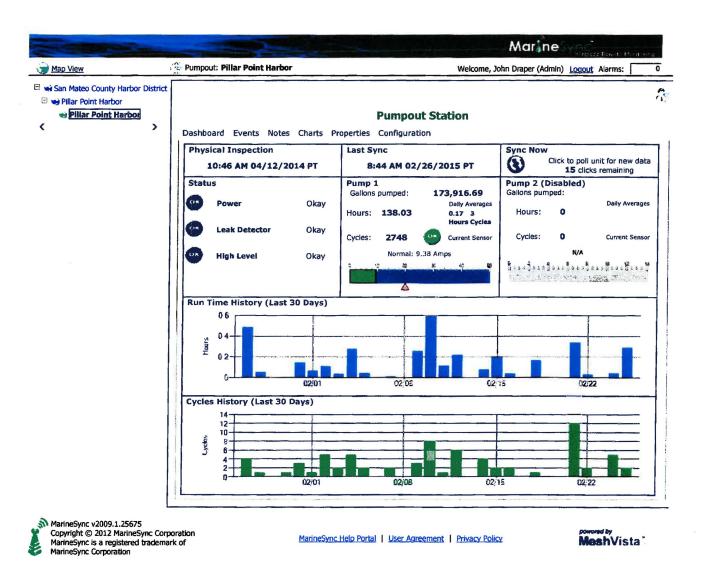












San Mateo County Harbor District Beach Replenishment Committee Meeting Report

Brown Act rules for committee members and the attending members of the public were reviewed.

The Committee agreed on the following mission statement:

Assist San Mateo County Harbor District with investigating, developing, and advocating beach replenishment for use within Pillar Point Harbor and Oyster Point Marina and seek partnerships and opportunities to participate in beneficial beach replenishment outside of the Harbor District jurisdiction.

Committee Goals:

- Slow down erosion
- Secure pedestrian access to beaches
- Maintain natural appearance
- Find beneficial locations for placement of dredged materials
- Identify agencies and common goals with agencies for collaborative efforts and partnerships
- Develop long-term sediment management plan

Three locations were identified as high priority for sand placement:

West Trail

- Princeton Shoreline
- Surfer's Beach

West Trail Update:

In July 2014 the Harbor District applied for an emergency permit with the Coastal Commission for repairs on the West Trail. In the fall of 2014, GHD, a consultant, was hired by the District to assist with the permit application process.

The original length of the project under the emergency permit was reduced from about 700 ft to just around the outfall and pipe area. The emergency permit has two components, culvert repair and temporary shoreline protection. The Coastal Commission requires the least environmentally damaging alternative for fill at the eroded portion of the trail around the culvert. However, GHD believed that sand bags would not be resilient enough to protect the area until further trail repairs can be accomplished and rather suggested rock slope protection (RSP) for the fill.

The permit application is 95% complete and should be presented at the next hearing.

The Beach Replenishment Committee will meet every three months and the next meeting will be held on May 19, 2015 at 7 pm at the Half Moon Bay Yacht Club.
